3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting certain insurers, nonprofit health service plans, and health maintenance organizations that provide covered benefits for annual 4 5 preventive care from denying coverage solely because a certain number of days 6 has not elapsed since the previous annual preventive care occurred: requiring 7 the certain insurers, nonprofit health service plans, and health maintenance 8 organizations to provide coverage for the certain types of annual preventive care 9 if certain conditions are met; prohibiting certain provisions from being construed to require coverage for a certain service; making certain requirements 10 11 applicable to health maintenance organizations; defining a certain term; 12 providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to health 13 insurance coverage for annual preventive care.
