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African American Heritage Preservation Program

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the African American Heritage Preservation Program 4 in the Maryland Historical Trust to identify and preserve certain buildings, $\mathbf{5}$ communities, and sites of historical and cultural importance to the African 6 American experience; requiring the Trust to develop and administer the $\overline{7}$ Program in consultation partnership with the Commission on African American 8 History and Culture; authorizing certain entities to submit, on or before a 9 certain date, an application to receive a grant for an African American heritage preservation capital project; requiring that grants to certain grantees under the 10 Program require a certain matching fund; requiring the Trust and Commission 11 to review grant applications before a certain date and make certain 12

 32 <u>American History and Culture administer the African American Heritage</u>
 33 <u>Preservation Program established under this Act using existing resources.</u>

34 SECTION $\frac{2}{2}$, 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 35 effect June 1, 2010. It shall remain effective for a period of 5 years and, at the end of

- 1 May 31, 2015, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall
- 2 be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
