- 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 17 (a) There is a Maryland Business Tax Reform Commission.
- 18 (b) (1) The Commission shall review and evaluate the State's current
- 19 business tax structure and make specific recommendations for changes to the State's
- 20 business tax structure to provide for fair and equitable taxation for all corporations
- 21 and other business entities doing business in the State.
- 22 (2) The Commission's recommendations may include, without
- 23 limitation, changes such as tax rate changes, tax base broadening measures, measures
