A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Criminal Law – Gang Activity – Jurisdiction over Juvenile Offenders

- FOR the purpose of excluding from the jurisdiction of juvenile court a child of at least a certain age alleged to have committed, as a member of a criminal gang, a certain act that would be a crime if committed by an adult; providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to the jurisdiction of the court over a juvenile offender involved in criminal gang activity.

- 23 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 24 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

$22 \\ 23 \\ 24$	(a) A person may not threaten an individual, or a friend or family member of an individual, with or use physical violence to coerce, induce, or solicit the individual to participate in or prevent the individual from leaving a criminal gang:

3 (c) A person who violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on 4 conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 4 years or a fine not exceeding 5 \$4,000 or both.

9 (a) A person may not:

10 (1) participate in a criminal gang knowing that the members of the 11 gang engage in an ongoing pattern of criminal gang activity; and

12 (2) knowingly and willfully direct or participate in the commission of 13 an underlying crime, or act by a juvenile that would be an underlying crime if 14 committed by an adult, committed for the benefit of, at the direction of, or in 15 association with a criminal gang.

16 (b) A person may not commit a violation of subsection (a) of this section 17 involving the commission of an underlying crime that results in the death of a victim.

18 (c) (1) (i) Except as provided in subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, a 19 person who violates this section is guilty of a felony and on conviction is subject to 20 imprisonment not exceeding 10 years or a fine not exceeding \$100,000 or both.

(ii) A person who violates subsection (b) of this section is guilty
of a felony and on conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 20 years or a
fine not exceeding \$100,000 or both.

24 (2) A sentence imposed under this section may be separate from and 25 consecutive to or concurrent with a sentence for any crime based on the act 26 establishing a violation of this section.

(d) A person may be charged with a violation of this section only byindictment, criminal information, or petition alleging a delinquent act.

(e) (1) The Attorney General, at the request of the State's Attorney for a
 county in which a violation or an act establishing a violation of this section occurs,
 may:

32 (i) aid in the investigation of the violation or act; and

33 (ii) prosecute the violation or act.

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1 (2) In exercising authority under paragraph (1) of this subsection, the 2 Attorney General has all the powers and duties of a State's Attorney, including the use 3 of the grand jury in the county, to prosecute the violation.

4 (3) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, in circumstances in 5 which violations of this section are alleged to have been committed in more than one 6 county, the respective State's Attorney of each county, or the Attorney General, may 7 join the causes of action in a single complaint with the consent of each State's Attorney 8 having jurisdiction over an offense sought to be joined.

9 (f) Notwithstanding any other provision of law and provided at least one 10 criminal gang activity of a criminal gang allegedly occurred in the county in which a 11 grand jury is sitting, the grand jury may issue subpoenas, summon witnesses, and 12 otherwise conduct an investigation of the alleged criminal gang's activities and 13 offenses in other counties.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall apply only
 to offenses committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
