CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

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State Highways - Mobile Produce Vendors - Required State Lease

- 3 FOR the purpose of expanding the application of a provision of law that prohibits 4 certain food vendors from operating on a State highway right-of-way without a 5 certain State lease to include mobile produce vendors; authorizing the State to 6 require a mobile seafood or produce vendor to submit an application and pay a 7 certain fee; prohibiting the State from entering into a lease with a mobile 8 produce vendor unless the applicable county licenses mobile produce vendors; 9 authorizing the State Highway Administration to adopt certain regulations; prohibiting a mobile produce vendor lessee from operating at certain locations; 10 11 providing that this Act does not diminish the authority of a county to license 12 and regulate mobile produce vendors; establishing certain criminal penalties for 13 a violation of this Act; providing for the enforcement of this Act; defining a 14 certain term; making certain stylistic changes; and generally relating to the 15 operations of mobile seafood and produce vendors.
