- 3 FOR the purpose of transferring certain responsibilities relating to the assessment of a 4 certain supervision fee from the Parole Commission to the Division of Parole $\mathbf{5}$ and Probation; repealing a requirement that the Division of Parole and 6 Probation investigate requests for a certain exemption under certain 7circumstances; requiring the Division to conduct a certain examination of a 8 supervisee at certain times for certain purposes; defining a certain term; 9 making conforming changes; and generally relating to fees paid by individuals 10 supervised by the Division of Parole and Probation requiring the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services to explain and provide certain 11 12information to a releasee; and generally relating to providing information on exemption from fees paid by individuals supervised by the Division of Parole 1314and Probation.
