2 Employees' Retirement and Pension Systems – Maryland School for the Deaf 3 Retirees – Overpayment of Benefits

- FOR the purpose of requiring the Board of Trustees of the State Retirement and 4 5 Pension System to suspend the application of certain annual retirement 6 allowance adjustments to certain retirees for a certain period of time until 7 certain retirement allowances equal a certain amount; requiring the Board of 8 Trustees to resume the application of certain annual retirement allowance 9 adjustments to certain retirees under certain circumstances; requiring the 10 Board of Trustees to calculate certain benefits for certain designated beneficiaries using a certain retirement allowance; providing that the Board of 11 12 Trustees is not required to recover certain overpayments made prior to a certain 13 date to certain retirees; and generally relating to the overpayment of retirement 14 benefits to retirees of the Maryland School for the Deaf.

- 2 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 3 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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- 6 (a) [If,] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN § 29–402 OF THIS ARTICLE, IF, because
- 7 of an error in the records of the several systems, a retiree or beneficiary receives a
- 8 benefit that differs from the benefit the retiree or beneficiary is entitled to receive, the
- 9 Board of Trustees shall:
- 10 (1) correct the error; and
- 11 (2) to the extent practicable, adjust the payment to the retiree or
- 12 beneficiary to provide the actuarial equivalent to which the retiree or beneficiary is
- 13 correctly entitled.

- 15 (A) THIS SECTION APPLIES TO A RETIREE OF THE EMPLOYEES'
- 16 RETIREMENT SYSTEM OR EMPLOYEES' PENSION SYSTEM WHO:
- 17 (1) RETIRED FROM THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM OR
- 18 EMPLOYEES' PENSION SYSTEM ON OR BEFORE JUNE 30, 2009;
- 19 (2) BEFORE RETIREMENT WAS AN EMPLOYEE OF THE MARYLAND
- 20 SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF; AND
- 21 (3) BEFORE RETIREMENT, AS AN EMPLOYEE FOR THE MARYLAND
- 22 SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF, WAS A 10-MONTH EMPLOYEE INCORRECTLY
- 23 CLASSIFIED AS A 12-MONTH EMPLOYEE.
- 24 (B) (1) If A RETIREE IS RECEIVING A BENEFIT THAT DIFFERS FROM
- 25 THE BENEFIT THE RETIREE IS ENTITLED TO RECEIVE, THE BOARD OF
- 26 TRUSTEES SHALL, BEGINNING JULY 1, 2010, AND EACH SUBSEQUENT JULY 1,
- 27 SUSPEND ANY ANNUAL RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE ADJUSTMENT THE RETIREE
- 28 MAY RECEIVE UNDER THIS SUBTITLE.
- 29 (2) BEGINNING JULY 1, 2010, AND EACH SUBSEQUENT JULY 1,
- 30 ANY ADJUSTMENT TO THE RETIREE'S ANNUAL RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE
- 31 DESCRIBED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION SHALL BE
- 32 CALCULATED USING:

- 1 (I) FOR ANY ADJUSTMENT CALCULATED UNDER PART II OR
 2 PART III OF THIS SUBTITLE, THE INITIAL ALLOWANCE THE RETIREE WAS
 3 ENTITLED TO RECEIVE AND NOT THE INITIAL ALLOWANCE THE RETIREE DID
 4 RECEIVE;
- 5 (II) FOR ANY ADJUSTMENT CALCULATED UNDER PART IV
 6 AND PART VI OF THIS SUBTITLE, THE CURRENT RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE THE
 7 RETIREE IS ENTITLED TO RECEIVE AND NOT THE CURRENT RETIREMENT
 8 ALLOWANCE THE RETIREE IS RECEIVING; OR
- 9 (III) FOR ANY ADJUSTMENT CALCULATED UNDER PART V OF
 10 THIS SUBTITLE, BOTH THE INITIAL ALLOWANCE THE RETIREE WAS ENTITLED TO
 11 RECEIVE AND NOT THE INITIAL ALLOWANCE THE RETIREE DID RECEIVE AND
 12 THE CURRENT RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE THE RETIREE IS ENTITLED TO
 13 RECEIVE AND NOT THE CURRENT RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE THE RETIREE IS
 14 RECEIVING.
- 15 (3) THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES SHALL SUSPEND ANY ANNUAL
 16 RETIREMENT ADJUSTMENT UNDER THIS SUBSECTION UNTIL THE TOTAL
 17 AMOUNT OF RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE THE RETIREE IS ENTITLED TO RECEIVE,
 18 INCLUDING ANY SUSPENDED ANNUAL RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE ADJUSTMENTS,
 19 EQUALS THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE THE RETIREE IS
 20 RECEIVING ON JULY 1, 2010.
- 21 (4) When the total amount of retirement allowance the 22 Retiree is entitled to receive, including any suspended annual 23 Retirement allowance adjustments, equals the total amount of 24 Retirement allowance the retiree is receiving on July 1, 2010, the 25 Board of Trustees shall resume adjusting the retiree's annual 26 Allowance on July 1 of each year in accordance with this subtitle.
- 27 IF A RETIREE DIES BEFORE THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF RETIREMENT 28ALLOWANCE THE RETIREE WAS ENTITLED TO RECEIVE, INCLUDING ANY SUSPENDED ANNUAL RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE ADJUSTMENTS, EQUALS THE 29 30 TOTAL AMOUNT OF RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE THE RETIREE WAS RECEIVING ON JULY 1, 2010, AND THE RETIREE HAS SELECTED AN OPTIONAL FORM OF 31 32 ALLOWANCE UNDER TITLE 21, SUBTITLE 4 OF THIS ARTICLE, THE DECEASED 33 RETIREE'S BENEFICIARY SHALL RECEIVE A BENEFIT CALCULATED ON THE 34 RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE THE DECEASED RETIREE WAS ENTITLED TO RECEIVE AT THE TIME OF THE RETIREE'S DEATH AND NOT WHAT THE RETIREE WAS 35 36 RECEIVING AT THE TIME OF THE RETIREE'S DEATH.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, in accordance with § 21–113 of the State Personnel and Pensions Article, the Board of Trustees of the State Retirement and Pension System is not required to recover any improper overpayment received by a retiree on or before July 1, 2010, if the retiree:			
5 6	(1) retired from the Employees' Retirement System or Employees' Pension System on or before June 30, 2009;			
7 8	(2) before retirement was an employee of the Maryland School for the Deaf; and			
9 10 11	(3) before retirement, as an employee for the Maryland School for the Deaf, was a 10-month employee incorrectly classified with the State Retirement Agency as a 12-month employee.			
12 13	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2010.
