1 AN ACT concerning

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State Retirement and Pension System – Eligible Governmental Units

- 3 FOR the purpose of providing that the effective date of certain eligible governmental 4 units to join the State Retirement and Pension System shall be postponed to a 5 certain date if the Board of Trustees for the State Retirement and Pension 6 System does not receive certain documents on or before a certain date from the 7 eligible governmental unit; making certain technical and clarifying changes to 8 the State Personnel and Pensions Article; deleting certain obsolete provisions in 9 the State Personnel and Pensions Article; defining certain terms; and generally 10 relating to eligible governmental units participating in the State Retirement and Pension System. 11

- 18 (a) If at least 60% of the law enforcement officers of an eligible governmental unit who are members of a local pension system **OR STATE SYSTEM** petition to become members of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System, the legislative body of the eligible governmental unit may approve the participation of these law enforcement officers in the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System as though the local pension system were not in operation.
- 24 (b) If at least 60% of the firefighters and paramedics employed by the Salisbury Fire Department petition to become members of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System, the legislative body of the City of Salisbury, as an eligible governmental unit, may approve the participation of these firefighters and paramedics in the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System.
- 29 (c) If at least 60% of the firefighters of an eligible governmental unit who are members of a local pension system **OR STATE SYSTEM** petition to become members of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System, the legislative body of the eligible governmental unit may approve the participation of these firefighters in the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System as though the local pension system were not in operation.

- 1 (A) [The] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, 2 THE effective date of participation for an eligible governmental unit is July 1 of the 3 year following the fiscal year in which the eligible governmental unit elects to 4 participate in the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System.
- 5 (B) IF AN ELIGIBLE GOVERNMENTAL UNIT DOES NOT PROVIDE THE
 6 BOARD OF TRUSTEES WITH THE NECESSARY DOCUMENTATION TO JOIN THE
 7 LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS' PENSION SYSTEM ON OR BEFORE THE
 8 EFFECTIVE DATE FOR THE ELIGIBLE GOVERNMENTAL UNIT, THE EFFECTIVE
 9 DATE SHALL BE POSTPONED UNTIL JULY 1 OF THE SECOND YEAR FOLLOWING

- 13 (a) If an eligible governmental unit approves participation in the Law 14 Enforcement Officers' Pension System, the operation of the local pension system **OR** 15 **STATE SYSTEM** with respect to the law enforcement officers, firefighters, or 16 paramedics terminates on the effective date.
 - (b) (1) On the effective date:
- 18 (i) the assets to the credit of the local pension system **OR**19 **STATE SYSTEM** that relate to the law enforcement officers, firefighters, or paramedics
 20 who elect to become members shall be transferred to the Law Enforcement Officers'
 21 Pension System; and
- 22 (ii) the trustee or other administrative head of the local pension 23 system shall certify the proportion of the funds of the local pension system **OR STATE** 24 **SYSTEM** that represents the accumulated contributions of the members as of that 25 date.
- 26 (2) The accumulated contributions shall be credited to the respective 27 annuity savings accounts of the members in the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension 28 System.
- 29 (3) The balance of the funds transferred to the Law Enforcement 30 Officers' Pension System shall be offset against the special accrued liability to be 31 funded by the participating governmental unit as provided by § 21–306.1(d) of this 32 article.

- If at least 60% of the local detention center officers of an eligible governmental unit who are members of a local pension system **OR STATE SYSTEM** petition to become members of the Correctional Officers' Retirement System, the legislative body of the eligible governmental unit may approve the participation of these local detention center officers in the Correctional Officers' Retirement System as though the local pension system were not in operation.

- (A) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, THE
 EFFECTIVE DATE OF PARTICIPATION FOR AN ELIGIBLE GOVERNMENTAL UNIT IS
 JULY 1 OF THE YEAR FOLLOWING THE FISCAL YEAR IN WHICH THE ELIGIBLE
 GOVERNMENTAL UNIT ELECTS TO PARTICIPATE IN THE CORRECTIONAL
 OFFICERS' RETIREMENT SYSTEM.
- 21 (B) If an eligible governmental unit does not provide the Board of Trustees with the necessary documentation to join the Correctional Officers' Retirement System on or before the Effective date for the eligible governmental unit, the effective date shall be postponed until July 1 of the second year following the fiscal year in which the eligible governmental unit elects to Participate in the Correctional Officers' Retirement System.

- 29 (a) If an eligible governmental unit approves participation in the 30 Correctional Officers' Retirement System, the operation of the local pension system **OR** 31 **STATE SYSTEM** with respect to the local detention center officers terminates on the 32 effective date.
 - (b) (1) On the effective date:

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- 1 (i) the assets to the credit of the local pension system **OR**2 **STATE SYSTEM** that relate to the local detention center officers who elect to become members shall be transferred to the Correctional Officers' Retirement System; and
 - (ii) the trustee or other administrative head of the local pension system **OR STATE SYSTEM** shall certify the proportion of the funds of the local pension system that represents the accumulated contributions of the members as of that date.
- 8 (2) The accumulated contributions shall be credited to the respective 9 annuity savings accounts of the members in the Correctional Officers' Retirement 10 System.
- 11 (3) The balance of the funds transferred to the Correctional Officers' 12 Retirement System shall be offset against the special accrued liability to be funded by 13 the participating governmental unit as provided by § 21–306.1(d) of this article.

- [(2) "Local pension system" includes the Employees' Retirement System, Employees' Pension System, Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System, or Correctional Officers' Retirement System if the eligible governmental unit participates under this title.]

- [(e)] (F) "Withdrawal date" means the date that a withdrawal by a participating governmental unit from [the employees' systems, the Local Fire and Police System, the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System, or the Correctional Officers' Retirement System] A STATE SYSTEM takes effect.

- [(a)] The legislative body of a participating governmental unit may withdraw from participation in [the employees' systems] A STATE SYSTEM and transfer to a local pension system OR ANOTHER STATE SYSTEM any of the following groups of

- employees of the governmental unit who consent to the withdrawal, AND WHO QUALIFY FOR MEMBERSHIP IN THE STATE SYSTEM OR LOCAL PENSION SYSTEM:
- 3 (1) all employees of the participating governmental unit;
- 4 (2) fire fighters;
- 5 (3) law enforcement personnel; [or]
- 6 (4) DETENTION CENTER OFFICERS; OR
