A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

State Retirement and Pension System – Noncontributory Former Vested Members – Vested Retirement Allowance

FOR the purpose of repealing certain provisions of the State Personnel and Pensions Article that permit certain former members of the State Retirement and Pension System to withdraw certain member contributions plus interest and receive a vested retirement allowance based only on certain employer contributions; and generally relating to vested retirement allowances for noncontributory former members of the State Retirement and Pension System.

- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 [(h) (1) If a former member who elected a vested allowance requests the 20 return of accumulated contributions before payment of the vested allowance begins, 21 the Board of Trustees shall return the accumulated contributions to the former 22 member.

(2) (i) Except as provided in subparagraphs (ii) and (iii) of this
paragraph, when the former member is eligible to begin receiving a vested allowance,
the former member shall receive a pension only.

1 (ii) When accumulated contributions are returned to a former 2 member of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System who is subject to the Law 3 Enforcement Officers' Modified Pension Benefit under Title 26, Subtitle 2, Part II of 4 this article, the former member is not entitled to further benefits on account of the 5 former member's previous membership unless the former member purchases the 6 service credit under § 26–307.1 of this article.

7 (iii) When accumulated contributions are returned to a former 8 member of the Employees' Pension System or Teachers' Pension System who is subject 9 to the contributory pension benefit or the Alternate Contributory Pension Selection, 10 the former member is not entitled to further benefits on account of the former 11 member's previous membership unless the former member purchases the service 12 credit under § 23-306.2 of this article.]

13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect14 July 1, 2010.
