BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 11 12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Criminal Law 13 14 3-204.15 (a) A person may not recklessly: 16 engage in conduct that creates a substantial risk of death or (1) serious physical injury to another; or 17 18 discharge a firearm from a motor vehicle in a manner that creates 19 a substantial risk of death or serious physical injury to another. 20 A person who violates this section is guilty of the misdemeanor of 21reckless endangerment and on conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 5

years or a fine not exceeding \$5,000 or both.
