A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 State Board of Dental Examiners – Materials Containing Mercury

- FOR the purpose of requiring dentists to ask patients, prior to performing any dental
 procedures or treatments that include the use of dental materials containing
 mercury, if the patient has a known allergy to mercury; requiring dentists to
 adhere to certain Federal Drug Administration guidance; and generally relating
 to dentists asking patients about known allergies to mercury and the Federal
 Drug Administration guidance on dental materials containing mercury.

15 WHEREAS, In July 2009, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) issued 16 guidance requiring the dental industry to address the issues of safety and 17 effectiveness for dental amalgam, mercury, and amalgam alloy; and

18 WHEREAS, The FDA guidance identified potential risks to health generally 19 associated with the use of dental amalgam devices; and

WHEREAS, The FDA guidance recommended labeling of dental amalgam,
 mercury, and amalgam alloy devices to include information sufficient to inform dental
 professionals of the proper use of the devices; and

WHEREAS, Mercury is a toxic metal and amalgam fillings are a combination of mercury and other metals, which at certain levels have been linked to brain and kidney damage; and

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW. [Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.



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1 WHEREAS, According to the American Dental Association, about 30 percent of 2 fillings given to patients are mercury–filled; and

3 WHEREAS, The FDA guidance considers the fillings "moderate risk" devices 4 and will require details about the risks and benefits of the products and will require 5 warnings against the use in patients with mercury allergies or in poorly ventilated 6 areas; now, therefore,

7 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 8 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article – Health Occupations

10 **4–506.1.**

(A) A DENTIST SHALL ASK A PATIENT, PRIOR TO PERFORMING ANY
 DENTAL PROCEDURE OR TREATMENT THAT INCLUDES THE USE OF DENTAL
 MATERIALS CONTAINING MERCURY, IF THE PATIENT HAS A KNOWN ALLERGY TO
 MERCURY.

(B) A DENTIST SHALL ADHERE TO THE FEDERAL DRUG
 ADMINISTRATION GUIDANCE ON DENTAL AMALGAM, MERCURY, AND AMALGAM
 ALLOY, INCLUDING RECOMMENDATIONS ON LABELING.

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect19 October 1, 2010.

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
