1	WHEREAS, The FDA guidance identified potential risks to health generally
2	associated with the use of dental amalgam devices; and
3	WHEREAS, The FDA guidance recommended labeling of dental amalgam,
4	mercury, and amalgam alloy devices to include information sufficient to inform dental
5	professionals of the proper use of the devices; and
6	WHEREAS, Mercury is a toxic metal and amalgam fillings are a combination of
7	mercury and other metals, which at certain levels have been linked to brain and
8	kidney damage; and
9	WHEREAS, According to the American Dental Association, about 30 percent of
10	fillings given to patients are mercury-filled; and
11	WHEREAS, The FDA guidance considers the fillings "moderate risk" devices
12	and will require details about the risks and benefits of the products and will require
13	warnings against the use in patients with mercury allergies or in poorly ventilated
