A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Workers' Compensation - Medical Presumptions

3 FOR the purpose of altering the occupational disease presumption under the workers' 4 compensation law as applied to certain firefighters, certain fire fighting 5 instructors, certain rescue squad members, certain advanced life support unit 6 members, and certain sworn members of the Office of the State Fire Marshal; 7 providing that certain diseases and cancers are considered occupational 8 diseases suffered in the line of duty and are compensable in a certain manner; 9 providing that a certain presumption applies only if certain circumstances are 10 met; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the occupational disease presumption for certain diseases and cancers under the 11 12 workers' compensation law.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 18
- 19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Labor and Employment

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- 22 A paid firefighter, paid fire fighting instructor, or sworn member of the 23Office of the State Fire Marshal employed by an airport authority, a county, a fire 24control district, a municipality, or the State or a volunteer firefighter, volunteer fire
- 25 fighting instructor, volunteer rescue squad member, or volunteer advanced life



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support unit member who is a covered employee under § 9–234 of this title is presumed to have an occupational disease that was suffered in the line of duty and is compensable under this title if:

- (1) the individual has heart disease, hypertension, or lung disease;
- (2) the heart disease, hypertension, or lung disease results in partial or total disability or death; and
 - (3) in the case of a volunteer firefighter, volunteer fire fighting instructor, volunteer rescue squad member, or volunteer advanced life support unit member, the individual has met a suitable standard of physical examination before becoming a firefighter, fire fighting instructor, rescue squad member, or advanced life support unit member.
- (b) (1) A paid police officer employed by an airport authority, a county, the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission, a municipality, or the State, a deputy sheriff of Montgomery County, or, subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, a deputy sheriff of Baltimore City, Montgomery County correctional officer, Prince George's County deputy sheriff, or Prince George's County correctional officer is presumed to be suffering from an occupational disease that was suffered in the line of duty and is compensable under this title if:
- 19 (i) the police officer, deputy sheriff, or correctional officer is 20 suffering from heart disease or hypertension; and
- 21 (ii) the heart disease or hypertension results in partial or total 22 disability or death.
 - (2) (i) A deputy sheriff of Baltimore City, Montgomery County correctional officer, Prince George's County deputy sheriff, or Prince George's County correctional officer is entitled to the presumption under this subsection only to the extent that the individual suffers from heart disease or hypertension that is more severe than the individual's heart disease or hypertension condition existing prior to the individual's employment as a deputy sheriff of Baltimore City, Montgomery County correctional officer, Prince George's County deputy sheriff, or Prince George's County correctional officer.
 - (ii) To be eligible for the presumption under this subsection, a deputy sheriff of Baltimore City, Montgomery County correctional officer, Prince George's County deputy sheriff, or Prince George's County correctional officer, as a condition of employment, shall submit to a medical examination to determine any heart disease or hypertension condition existing prior to the individual's employment as a deputy sheriff of Baltimore City, Montgomery County correctional officer, Prince George's County deputy sheriff, or Prince George's County correctional officer.
- 38 (c) A paid firefighter, paid fire fighting instructor, or a sworn member of the 39 Office of the State Fire Marshal employed by an airport authority, a county, a fire

control district, a municipality, or the State or a volunteer firefighter, volunteer fire fighting instructor, volunteer rescue squad member, or volunteer advanced life support unit member who is a covered employee under § 9–234 of this title is presumed to be suffering from an occupational disease that was suffered in the line of duty and is compensable under this title if the individual:

- (1) has leukemia, MULTIPLE MYELOMA, MELANOMA, or pancreatic, prostate, rectal, [or] throat, ESOPHAGEAL, LYMPHATIC, TESTICULAR, BRAIN, LUNG, BLADDER, KIDNEY, BREAST, LIVER, OVARIAN, CERVICAL, OR URETHRAL cancer, OR CANCER LOCATED IN THE DIGESTIVE SYSTEM that is caused by contact with a toxic substance that the individual has encountered in the line of duty;
- 11 (2) has completed at least 5 years of service as a firefighter, fire 12 fighting instructor, rescue squad member, or advanced life support unit member or in 13 a combination of those jobs in the department where the individual currently is 14 employed or serves;
- 15 (3) is unable to perform the normal duties of a firefighter, fire fighting 16 instructor, rescue squad member, or advanced life support unit member in the 17 department where the individual currently is employed or serves because of the cancer 18 or leukemia disability; and
 - (4) in the case of a volunteer firefighter, volunteer fire fighting instructor, volunteer rescue squad member, or volunteer advanced life support unit member, has met a suitable standard of physical examination before becoming a firefighter, fire fighting instructor, rescue squad member, or advanced life support unit member.
 - (D) A PAID OR VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTER OR FIRE FIGHTING INSTRUCTOR, A VOLUNTEER RESCUE SQUAD MEMBER, AN ADVANCED LIFE SUPPORT UNIT MEMBER, OR A SWORN MEMBER OF THE OFFICE OF THE STATE FIRE MARSHAL EMPLOYED BY AN AIRPORT AUTHORITY, A COUNTY, A FIRE CONTROL DISTRICT, A MUNICIPALITY, OR THE STATE WHO IS A COVERED EMPLOYEE UNDER § 9–234 OF THIS TITLE IS PRESUMED TO HAVE AN OCCUPATIONAL DISEASE SUFFERED IN THE LINE OF DUTY AND IS COMPENSABLE UNDER THIS TITLE IF THE INDIVIDUAL:
 - (1) HAS A STRAIN OF HEPATITIS GENERALLY RECOGNIZED BY THE MEDICAL COMMUNITY, MENINGOCOCCAL MENINGITIS, OR TUBERCULOSIS CAUSED BY AN EXPOSURE DURING THE PERFORMANCE OF DUTIES ASSOCIATED WITH THE INDIVIDUAL'S EMPLOYMENT THAT RESULTS IN PARTIAL OR TOTAL DISABILITY OR DEATH; AND
 - (2) DID NOT SUFFER FROM THIS OCCUPATIONAL DISEASE AT THE TIME OF EMPLOYMENT OR, IN THE CASE OF A VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTER, VOLUNTEER FIRE FIGHTING INSTRUCTOR, VOLUNTEER RESCUE SQUAD

- 3. the employee files the claim for workers' compensation on or before the third anniversary of the last date that the employee was assigned to a position that regularly placed the employee in an outdoor wooded environment.

- [(e)] (F) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, any paid firefighter, paid fire fighting instructor, sworn member of the Office of the State Fire Marshal, paid police officer, paid law enforcement employee of the Department of Natural Resources, a park police officer or employee of the Maryland–National Capital Park and Planning Commission, deputy sheriff of Montgomery County, deputy sheriff of Baltimore City, Montgomery County correctional officer, deputy sheriff of Prince George's County, or Prince George's County correctional officer who is eligible for benefits under subsection (a), (b), (c), or [(d)] (E) of this section or the dependents of those individuals shall receive the benefits in addition to any benefits that the individual or the dependents of the individual are entitled to receive under the retirement system in which the individual was a participant at the time of the claim.
- (2) The benefits received under this title shall be adjusted so that the weekly total of those benefits and retirement benefits does not exceed the weekly salary that was paid to the paid law enforcement employee of the Department of Natural Resources, a park police officer or employee of the Maryland–National Capital Park and Planning Commission, firefighter, fire fighting instructor, sworn member of the Office of the State Fire Marshal, police officer, deputy sheriff, or Prince George's County or Montgomery County correctional officer.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2010. It shall remain effective for a period of 5 years and, at the end of June 30, 2015, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
