4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11	FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person who is responsible for pupils on a school bus from permitting any pupil to stand while the bus is in motion; prohibiting a person who is responsible for pupils on a school bus from permitting any pupil to sit on the floor of the school bus; establishing that this Act does not apply during a certain period of time at the beginning of a school year for public schools or, under certain circumstances, in an emergency; making certain conforming changes; and generally relating to a prohibition on permitting pupils to sit on the floor or stand on a school bus.

17 18	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
19	Article - Transportation

21	(a) The driver of a school bus:
22	(1) Is responsible for its operation; and
$\begin{array}{c} 23 \\ 24 \end{array}$	(2) May not drive it into any roadway without first stopping and determining that there is no danger from any other vehicle.

1	(b) The person responsible for any pupils on a school bus is:
2	(1) The teacher on the bus; or
3	(2) If a teacher is not present, the driver.
4 5 6	[(c) A person responsible for pupils on a school bus may not permit the number of standing pupils to exceed one pupil for each part of the aisle that is bounded on both sides by forward facing seats.
7 8 9	(d) A person responsible for pupils on a school bus may not permit any pupil to stand if the school bus is equipped only with lengthwise or a combination of lengthwise and forward facing seats.]
10 11 12	(C) (1) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, A PERSON RESPONSIBLE FOR PUPILS ON A SCHOOL BUS MAY NOT PERMIT ANY PUPIL TO STAND WHILE THE BUS IS IN MOTION.
13	(2) This subsection does not apply during:
14 15	(I) THE FIRST 10 SCHOOL DAYS OF A SCHOOL YEAR FOR PUBLIC SCHOOLS AS DEFINED IN § 1–201 OF THE EDUCATION ARTICLE; OR
16 17 18	(II) AN EMERGENCY, IF PERMITTING A PUPIL TO STAND WHILE A SCHOOL BUS IS IN MOTION IS NECESSARY IN ORDER TO TRANSPORT PUPILS TO A SAFE LOCATION.
19 20	[(e)] (D) A person responsible for pupils on a school bus may not permit any pupil to stand in front of the stanchion and guardrail.
21 22	[(f)] (E) A person responsible for pupils on a school bus may not permit any pupil to operate the front door opening mechanism, except in an emergency.
23 24	[(g)] (F) A person responsible for pupils on a school bus may not require OF PERMIT any pupil to sit on the floor.
25 26	[(h)] (G) Except for the driver and any fuel station attendant, a person may not occupy a school bus while it is being supplied with fuel.
27 28 29	[(i)] (H) Either the driver or an adult aide assigned to each school vehicle that is used to transport handicapped children shall be certified as having successfully completed a first aid—safety course approved by the Department of Education.

30 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 31 October 1, 2010.
