1 Before taking office, a member shall take and subscribe to the oath (e) 2 prescribed in Article I, § 9 of the Maryland Constitution.

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- The Governor may remove a member for incompetence, misconduct, or (f) other good cause, upon written charges stating the Governor's grounds for dismissal and after affording the member notice and an ample opportunity to be heard.
- The Governor shall request the county central committee (g) (1) representing the majority party or the principal minority party, as appropriate, to submit a list of at least four eligible individuals from which the Governor may make an appointment of a regular member or a substitute member of the local board.
- 10 The Governor may reject all of the nominees if the Governor determines them to be unfit or incompetent, in which case the Governor shall notify 11 12 the State Board in writing and request an additional list of at least four eligible 13 nominees from the county central committee. A third list may be requested in the 14 same manner.
- If a list containing the names of four eligible nominees is not 15 submitted within 20 days of a request or if all the nominees on three lists are rejected, 16 17 the Governor may appoint any eligible person who is a member of the appropriate 18 political party.
- 19 (4)Except as provided in subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, 20 each appointment shall be subject to confirmation by the Senate of Maryland.
- In Caroline, Dorchester, and Kent counties, if there is no (ii) 22resident Senator of the particular county, the confirmation required under 23subparagraph (i) of this paragraph shall be by the House of Delegates of Maryland.
 - If an appointee is rejected, the Governor shall make another appointment from the list or lists submitted under paragraphs (1) and (2) of this subsection. If a list is not provided, or the nominees on three lists are rejected, the Governor may appoint an eligible individual as provided in paragraph (3) of this subsection.
- 29 (h) Except as provided in subsections [(j) and (k)] (J), (K), AND (L) of (1) 30 this section, if a member of a local board dies, resigns, is removed, or becomes 31 ineligible:
- 32 (i) the substitute member belonging to the same political party 33 shall become a regular member of the local board; and
- 34 the Governor shall appoint an eligible person from the same (ii) 35 political party to be the new substitute member.

- 1 (2) If a substitute member of a local board becomes a regular member 2 as provided in paragraph (1)(ii) of this subsection, dies, resigns, is removed, or 3 becomes ineligible when the confirming legislative body is not in session, the Governor 4 shall appoint an eligible person from the same political party as the predecessor 5 substitute member to fill the vacancy. That individual shall serve until the earlier of:
- 6 (i) the adjournment of the next session of the General 7 Assembly; or
- 8 (ii) the appointment of another individual to fill the same 9 vacancy.
- 10 (i) A board shall meet within 20 days after the beginning of the term to elect 11 one of its regular members as president.
- 12 (j) (1) In Prince George's County, the local board consists of five regular 13 members and three substitute members.
- 14 (2) Four regular members and two substitute members shall be of the 15 majority party, and one regular member and one substitute member shall be of the 16 principal minority party.
- 17 (3) If a vacancy occurs on the local board among the members from the majority party, the Governor shall designate one of the substitute members from that party to fill the vacancy.
- 20 (k) (1) In Montgomery County, the local board consists of five regular 21 members and two substitute members.
- 22 (2) Three regular members and one substitute member shall be of the 23 majority party, and two regular members and one substitute member shall be of the 24 principal minority party.
