- FOR the purpose of requiring the State Department of Education to apply for grants from the Early Learning Challenge Fund; requiring the Department to take certain actions before submitting an application; requiring the application to contain certain information; making this Act subject to a certain contingency; and generally relating to the application for grants from the Early Learning Challenge Fund.
- 9 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 10 MARYLAND, That:
- 11 (a) The State Department of Education shall seek federal funds for early learning initiatives by submitting an application for grants from the Early Learning Challenge Fund.
- 14 (b) Before submitting an application for grants from the Early Learning
 15 Challenge Fund, the Department shall identify the conditions necessary for a
 16 competitive application and shall identify actions necessary to remove impediments to
 17 being competitive.
- 18 (c) (1) In the application for grants from the Early Learning Challenge 19 Fund, the Department shall describe the ways it seeks to build a comprehensive, 20 high–quality, early learning system for children birth to age five.
- 21 (2) The application shall include all of the information required for the 22 Early Learning Challenge Fund, which may include information on the following:
