## A BILL ENTITLED

2 **Budget - Reductions of Appropriations** 3 FOR the purpose of altering the maximum reduction that the Governor can make to an appropriation in the State budget; requiring the Governor to present 4 5 proposed reductions to the budget committees of the General Assembly within a 6 certain period of time before seeking approval of the Board of Public Works; and 7 generally relating to the State budget and reductions of appropriations. 8 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, 9 Article – State Finance and Procurement 10 Section 7–213 Annotated Code of Maryland 11 12 (2009 Replacement Volume)

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 13
- MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 14
- 15 **Article - State Finance and Procurement**
- 16 7–213.

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- 17 Except as provided in [subsection (b)] SUBSECTIONS (B) AND (C) of this 18 section, with the approval of the Board of Public Works, the Governor may reduce, by 19 not more than [25%] 10%, any appropriation:
  - (1) that the Governor considers unnecessary; or
- 21 that is subject to budgetary reductions required under the budget (2)22 bill as approved by the General Assembly.
