# A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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## Maryland Communities for a Lifetime Act

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Communities for a Lifetime Program within the Department of Aging; defining a certain term; altering the 4  $\mathbf{5}$ membership of the Interagency Committee on Aging Services; providing for the 6 term of a representative of a Community for a Lifetime on the Interagency 7Committee; prohibiting the reappointment of a representative of a Community 8 for a Lifetime for more than a certain number of terms; requiring the 9 Interagency Committee to plan for assisting Communities for a Lifetime 10 annually; altering the composition of local interagency committees; requiring 11 the Secretary of Aging to determine the amount of a grant for a proposed or 12existing senior activities center capital improvement after considering whether 13a Community for a Lifetime is affected by the project; requiring the Senior 14 Citizen Activities Center Operating Fund to be used to benefit Communities for 15a Lifetime in a certain manner; requiring the Secretary of Aging, with the 16 advice of the Innovations in Aging Services Advisory Council, to include 17provisions for funding grants sought by Communities for a Lifetime within an 18 Innovations in Aging Services Program plan in a certain manner; altering the membership of the Innovations in Aging Services Advisory Council; establishing 19 20the purpose of this Act; requiring the Department of Aging, in consultation with 21area agencies on aging and the Interagency Committee on Aging Services, to 22oversee and coordinate the Maryland Communities for a Lifetime Program; 23requiring the Department of Aging to certify a community as a Community for a 24Lifetime under certain circumstances; requiring the Department of Aging to 25support Communities for a Lifetime in a certain manner; requiring a 26Community for a Lifetime to be considered a priority funding area; and 27generally relating to establishing a Maryland Communities for a Lifetime 28Program.
