Hunting Licenses - Exemption for Disabled Armed Forces Members

- FOR the purpose of creating an exemption from the requirement to obtain a hunting license under certain circumstances for a person who serves in the armed forces and has a service—connected disability; providing that the exemption applies only to hunting on private property; requiring a person who hunts under the exemption to possess certain identification; and generally relating to exemptions from the requirement to obtain a hunting license.

- 23 (b) To provide a fund to pay the expense of protecting and managing wildlife,
- and preventing unauthorized persons from hunting them, a person may not hunt or
- 25 attempt to hunt during open season and in any permitted manner any game birds and



- 1 mammals in the State without first having procured either a resident or nonresident 2 hunter's license. The parcel of farmland is located in Maryland and an 19 adjacent state; 20 В. The owner's primary residence is on the parcel of 21farmland; and 22C. The adjacent state extends similar privileges to a 23 resident of Maryland; 24(ii) Any resident serving in the armed forces of the United States while on leave in the State, during the resident's leave period, if, while hunting, 2526the resident possesses a copy of the resident's official leave order; [and] 27 (iii) WITH RESPECT TO HUNTING ON PRIVATE PROPERTY, ANY PERSON SERVING IN THE ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES WHO HAS 2829 A SERVICE-CONNECTED DISABILITY, IF, WHILE HUNTING, THE PERSON 30 POSSESSES VALID MILITARY IDENTIFICATION; AND 31 (IV) Any unarmed person participating in an organized foxhunt.
