# A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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## Maryland Clean Energy Center – Miscellaneous Provisions

3 FOR the purpose of altering the quorum requirement for the Maryland Clean Energy Center Board; altering the minimum vote required for the Board to act; 4  $\mathbf{5}$ designating employees and officials of the Maryland Clean Energy Center as 6 State personnel under the Maryland Tort Claims Act; authorizing employees 7 and retirees of the Maryland Clean Energy Center to participate in the State 8 Employee and Retiree Health and Welfare Benefits Program, and requiring the 9 Maryland Clean Energy Center to pay to the State the Center's share of the cost 10 of the Program; authorizing the Maryland Clean Energy Center to participate in the Employees' Pension System; and generally relating to the Maryland 11 12Clean Energy Center.
