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Maryland Clean Energy Center – Miscellaneous Provisions

3 FOR the purpose of altering the quorum requirement for the Maryland Clean Energy 4 Center Board; altering the minimum vote required for the Board to act; $\mathbf{5}$ designating employees and officials of the Maryland Clean Energy Center as 6 State personnel under the Maryland Tort Claims Act; authorizing employees 7 and retirees of the Maryland Clean Energy Center to participate in the State 8 Employee and Retiree Health and Welfare Benefits Program, and requiring the 9 Maryland Clean Energy Center to pay to the State the Center's share of the cost 10 of the Program; authorizing the Maryland Clean Energy Center to participate in the Employees' Pension System subjecting the Maryland Clean Energy 11 Center to the procurement procedures relating to minority business 1213participation; and generally relating to the Maryland Clean Energy Center.
