## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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## State Government - Silver-Haired Legislature

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Silver-Haired Legislature; establishing the goals of the legislature; providing for the appointment of the members of the 4 5 legislature; specifying the membership and terms of members of the legislature; 6 requiring the legislature to be a bicameral legislature with each house made up 7 of certain members and modeled after the General Assembly; requiring the 8 legislature to work with the Department of Aging to adopt certain bylaws and 9 procedures, meet once a year to conduct a certain model legislative session, and 10 advise and work with the Governor and the General Assembly regarding the legislature's legislative priorities; authorizing the legislature to use the State 11 12 House for a certain purpose under certain circumstances; providing for the 13 initial appointment and term of the members; and generally relating to the 14 Silver-Haired Legislature.

1	(A) (1) THERE IS A SILVER-HAIRED LEGISLATURE.
2	(2) THE GOALS OF THE SILVER-HAIRED LEGISLATURE ARE TO:
3	(I) MOTIVATE OLDER CITIZENS TO REALIZE THAT
4	LEGISLATIVE INVOLVEMENT IS A PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITY OF EFFECTIVE
5	CITIZENSHIP;
6	(II) HELP OLDER MARYLANDERS KNOW THAT IF THEY ARE
7	TO BECOME A VIABLE POLITICAL FORCE, THEY MUST BECOME INFORMED AND
8	KNOWLEDGEABLE ABOUT THE ISSUES FACING THEIR COMMUNITY, STATE, AND
9	COUNTRY;
10	(III) DEVELOP A FORUM FOR OLDER PERSONS TO DISCUSS
11	AND DEBATE ISSUES CONCERNING THEIR OWN WELFARE AND THAT OF OTHER
12	CITIZENS;
13	(IV) EDUCATE ITS MEMBERS AS TO THEIR ADVOCACY ROLE

21	(B) (1) THE SILVER-HAIRED LEGISLATURE SHALL BE COMPOSED OF
22	THE SAME NUMBER OF MEMBERS AS THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.
23	(2) EACH MEMBER OF THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF DELEGATES
24	OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY SHALL APPOINT ONE MEMBER OF THE
25	SILVER-HAIRED LEGISLATURE.
26	(3) A MEMBER SHALL BE:
27	(I) AT LEAST 60 YEARS OLD; AND
28	(II) A REGISTERED VOTER OF THE DISTRICT FROM WHICH
29	THE MEMBER IS APPOINTED.

THE TERM OF A MEMBER IS 2 YEARS.

1 2	(II) A MEMBER SHALL CONTINUE TO SERVE UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED.
3	(C) THE SILVER-HAIRED LEGISLATURE SHALL:
4	(1) BE A BICAMERAL LEGISLATURE WITH:
5 6	(I) MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE SENATE TO SERVE IN ONE HOUSE; AND
7 8	(II) MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES TO SERVE IN THE OTHER HOUSE.
9 10	(2) BE MODELED AFTER THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY IN STRUCTURE AND FORMAT;
11	(3) ELECT THE PRESIDING OFFICERS IN EACH HOUSE;
12 13 14	(4) WORK WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF AGING TO ADOPT BYLAWS AND PROCEDURES TO GOVERN THE INTERNAL OPERATIONS OF THE LEGISLATURE;
15 16 17	(5) MEET ONCE EACH YEAR TO CONDUCT A MODEL LEGISLATIVE SESSION THAT INCLUDES MEMBERS PRESENTING, DEBATING, AND VOTING ON BILLS AND RESOLUTIONS; AND
18 19 20	(6) ADVISE AND WORK WITH THE GOVERNOR AND THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY REGARDING THE LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES OF THE SILVER-HAIRED LEGISLATURE.
21 22 23 24	(D) THE SILVER-HAIRED LEGISLATURE MAY USE THE STATE HOUSE TO CONDUCT THE MODEL LEGISLATIVE SESSION REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION WHEN THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY IS NOT IN SESSION AND THE STATE HOUSE IS OPEN TO THE PUBLIC.
25	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:
26 27	(1) The initial members of the Silver–Haired Legislature shall be appointed on or before December 31, 2010; and
28	(2) The initial term of the members shall begin on January 1, 2011.
29	SECTION 3 AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED. That this Act shall take effect.
