### 1 AN ACT concerning

# 2 Employees' Pension System – Eligibility Service Credit State Retirement and 3 Health Benefits – Early Service Retirement Allowance and Health Insurance 4 Benefits – Eligibility

FOR the purpose of requiring the Board of Trustees of the State Retirement and  $\mathbf{5}$ 6 Pension System to apply certain overtime earned by certain individuals in  $\overline{7}$ certain employment during a certain period of time to the individual's eligibility 8 service credit in the Employees' Pension System if the individual applies for a 9 certain early service retirement allowance; authorizing certain individuals to purchase certain service credit in the Employees' Pension System; requiring 10 11 certain individuals who choose to purchase certain service credit, to pay to the 12 Board of Trustees of the State Retirement and Pension System a certain 13amount for a certain service credit; requiring certain individuals to complete certain claims and make certain payments to the Board of Trustees on or before 14a certain date; providing that certain individuals may enroll and participate in 1516 the health insurance benefit options established under the State Employee and 17Retiree Health and Welfare Benefits Program under certain circumstances; requiring certain individuals to complete a certain enrollment form and be 18 entitled to a certain subsidy; providing for the termination of this Act; and 1920generally relating to eligibility <del>service credit</del> for early service retirement allowances in the Employees' Pension System and health insurance benefits 21 22under the State Retirement and Pension System and the State Employee and Retiree Health and Welfare Benefits Program. 23

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1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 2 MARYLAND, That:

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(a) This section applies only to an individual who:

4 (1) on or after January 1, 1987, began employment with the Wicomico
5 County Health Department and became a member of the Employees' Pension System
6 under the State Retirement and Pension System;

7 (2) on or before July 1, 2001, ceased employment with the Wicomico
8 County Health Department and became a member of the Employees' Pension System
9 under the State Retirement and Pension System; and

10 (3) at the time the individual ceased employment with the Wicomico 11 County Health Department, the individual had more than 14 years and less than 15 12 years of eligibility service in the Employees' Pension System of the State Retirement 13 and Pension System.

14 (b) If an individual applies for an early service retirement allowance under 15 Section 23-402 of the State Personnel and Pensions Article, the Board of Trustees of 16 the State Retirement and Pension System shall apply any overtime the individual 17 earned while an employee of the Wicomico County Health Department to the 18 individual's eligibility service credit in the Employees' Pension System of the State 19 Retirement and Pension System.

(b) An individual described under subsection (a) of this section may elect to
 purchase service credit in the Employees' Pension System under Title 23 of the State
 Personnel and Pensions Article for the period of time the individual was employed by
 the Wicomico County Health Department as a contractual employee that is necessary
 to qualify for early retirement.

(c) An individual who elects to purchase service credit in the Employees'
 Pension System under subsection (b) of this section shall pay to the Board of Trustees
 of the State Retirement and Pension System an amount equal to one-half of the
 annuity reserve and one-half of the pension reserve required to fund the additional
 allowance.

- 30(d)To purchase contractual service credit under subsection (b) of this section,31on or before December 31, 2010, an individual shall:
- 32 (1) complete a claim for the service credit and file it with the Board of
   33 Trustees on a form that the Board of Trustees provides; and
- 34 (2) pay to the Board of Trustees an amount equal to the amount 35 determined under subsection (c) of this section.

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1	(e) <u>Notwithstanding the provisions of § 2–508(b)(1) of the State Personnel</u>
2	and Pensions Article, an individual described under subsection (a) of this section may
3	enroll and participate in the health insurance benefit options established under the
4	State Employee and Retiree Health and Welfare Benefits Program for so long as the
<b>5</b>	individual is receiving a retirement allowance from the State.
6	(f) <u>To enroll and participate in the State Employee and Retiree Health and</u>
7	Welfare Benefits Program under subsection (e) of this section, on or before December
8	<u>31, 2010, an individual shall:</u>
9	(1) <u>complete an enrollment form and submit it to the Department of</u>
10	Budget and Management; and
11	(2) <u>be entitled to the State subsidy allowed a State employee for each</u>
12	year of the retiree's creditable service, as provided under § 2-508(c)(2) of the State
13	Personnel and Pensions Article.
14	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
15	July 1, 2010. It shall remain effective for a period of 6 months and, at the end of

- 16 December 31, 2010, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act 17 shall be abarented and of we forther force and effect
- 17 shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
