CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Prior Authorizations of State Debt to Fund Capital Projects – Alterations**

3 FOR the purpose of amending certain prior Acts of the General Assembly that
4 authorized the creation of State Debt through the issuance, sale, and delivery of
5 general obligation bonds, the proceeds of which were designated for funding
6 certain capital projects; extending the deadline by which certain loan proceeds
7 must be expended or encumbered by the Board of Public Works; extending the
8 deadline by which certain grantees must present evidence to the Board of Public
9 Works that certain matching funds will be provided; altering and expanding the
10 authorized uses of certain grants; altering the purpose of certain grants;
11 altering the grantees under certain projects; altering the location of certain
12 grants; reducing the amount of certain grants and increasing the amount of
13 certain grants; ~~repealing~~ altering the requirement that a certain grantee grant and convey
14 a certain easement; ~~repealing~~ altering the requirement that certain grantees
15 provide a certain matching fund; altering the matching fund requirements of
16 certain grants; providing that a certain facility may only be used for certain
17 recreational purposes and may not be used for ~~residential~~ certain purposes;
18 making this Act an emergency measure; providing for the effective date of
19 certain provisions of this Act; and generally relating to amending prior
20 authorizations of State Debt by the General Assembly to fund certain capital
21 projects.

32 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
 33 MARYLAND, That:

34 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on
 35 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Baltimore
 36 City – Ivy Family Support Center Loan of 2001 in a total principal amount equal to

1 the lesser of (i) \$225,000 or (ii) the amount of the matching fund provided in
2 accordance with Section 1(5) below. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale,
3 and delivery of State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board
4 of Public Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with §§ 8–117 through
5 8–124 of the State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, § 22 of the Code.

6 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold
7 as a single issue or may be consolidated and sold as part of a single issue of bonds
8 under § 8–122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

9 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer
10 and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and
11 delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then
12 shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the
13 Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable
14 architects' and engineers' fees: as a grant to the Board of Directors of the Epsilon
15 Omega Foundation, Inc. (referred to hereafter in this Act as "the grantee") for the
16 planning, design, construction, renovation, and capital equipping of the Ivy Family
17 Support Center, to be located at 3515 Dolfield Avenue in Baltimore, Maryland.

18 (4) An annual State tax is imposed on all assessable property in the State in
19 rate and amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds, as and
20 when due and until paid in full. The principal shall be discharged within 15 years
21 after the date of issuance of the bonds.

22 (5) Prior to the payment of any funds under the provisions of this Act for the
23 purposes set forth in Section 1(3) above, the grantee shall provide and expend a
24 matching fund. No part of the grantee's matching fund may be provided, either
25 directly or indirectly, from funds of the State, whether appropriated or
26 unappropriated. The fund may consist of real property, in kind contributions, or funds
27 expended prior to the effective date of this Act. In case of any dispute as to the amount
28 of the matching fund or what money or assets may qualify as matching funds, the
29 Board of Public Works shall determine the matter and the Board's decision is final.
30 The grantee has until June 1, 2003, to present evidence satisfactory to the Board of
31 Public Works that a matching fund will be provided. If satisfactory evidence is
32 presented, the Board shall certify this fact and the amount of the matching fund to the
33 State Treasurer, and the proceeds of the loan equal to the amount of the matching
34 fund shall be expended for the purposes provided in this Act. Any amount of the loan
35 in excess of the amount of the matching fund certified by the Board of Public Works
36 shall be canceled and be of no further effect.

37 (6) The proceeds of the loan must be expended or encumbered by the Board
38 of Public Works for the purposes provided in this Act no later than June 1, [2010]
39 **2012**. If any funds authorized by this Act remain unexpended or unencumbered after
40 June 1, [2010] **2012**, the amount of the unencumbered or unexpended authorization
41 shall be canceled and be of no further effect. If bonds have been issued for the loan, the

1 amount of unexpended or unencumbered bond proceeds shall be disposed of as
2 provided in § 8–129 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

33 purposes set forth in Section 1(3) above, the grantee shall provide and expend a
34 matching fund. No part of the grantee’s matching fund may be provided, either
