## A BILL ENTITLED

## AN ACT concerning

## Baltimore City - Alcoholic Beverages - License Fees

FOR the purpose of requiring certain establishments in Baltimore City for which certain alcoholic beverages licenses have been issued to pay additional fees if live entertainment or certain services are provided; altering certain license fees for establishments according to seating capacity; altering certain 1-day license fees under certain circumstances; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages licenses fees in Baltimore City.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages

5-201.
(a) (1) A Class B beer and light wine license shall be issued by the license issuing authority of the county in which the place of business is located. The holder

may keep for sale and sell beer and light wines at retail at any hotel or restaurant, at the place described in the license, for consumption on the premises or elsewhere.
(d) (1) [In] THIS SUBSECTION APPLIES ONLY IN Baltimore City[the].
(2) THE annual license fee is $\$ 165$.
(3) IN ADDITION TO THE ANNUAL LICENSE FEE, THE LICENSEE SHALL PAY ANNUALLY:
(I) $\$ 500$ IF THE LICENSEE PROVIDES LIVE ENTERTAINMENT;
(II) $\$ 200$ IF THE LICENSEE PROVIDES OUTDOOR TABLE OR CAFE SERVICE; OR
(III) $\$ 700$ IF THE LICENSEE PROVIDES BOTH LIVE ENTERTAINMENT AND OUTDOOR TABLE OR CAFE SERVICE.

5-401.
(a) (1) A Class D beer and light wine license shall be issued by the license issuing authority of the county in which the place of business is located. The license authorizes its holder to keep for sale and to sell beer and light wines at retail, at the place described in the license, for consumption on the premises or elsewhere. The license may not be issued for any drugstore.
(d) (1) [In] THIS SUBSECTION APPLIES ONLY IN Baltimore City[the].
(2) THE annual license fee is $\$ 165$.
(3) IN ADDITION TO THE ANNUAL LICENSE FEE, THE LICENSEE SHALL PAY ANNUALLY:
(I) $\$ 500$ IF THE LICENSEE PROVIDES LIVE ENTERTAINMENT;
(II) $\$ 200$ IF THE LICENSEE PROVIDES OUTDOOR TABLE OR CAFE SERVICE; OR
(III) $\$ 700$ IF THE LICENSEE PROVIDES BOTH LIVE ENTERTAINMENT AND OUTDOOR TABLE OR CAFE SERVICE.

6-401.
(a) (1) A Class D beer, wine and liquor license shall be issued by the license issuing authority of the county in which the place of business is located. It authorizes the holder to keep for sale and sell all alcoholic beverages at retail at the place described in it, for consumption on the premises or elsewhere. A license may not be issued for any drugstore.
(d) (1) Subject to § $11-503(\mathrm{~b})(2)$ of this article, in Baltimore City the annual license fee is $\$ 825$.
(2) In Addition to the annual license fee, the licensee SHALL PAY ANNUALLY:
(I) $\$ 500$ IF THE LICENSEE PROVIDES LIVE

## ENTERTAINMENT;

(II) $\$ 200$ IF THE LICENSEE PROVIDES OUTDOOR TABLE OR CAFE SERVICE; OR
(III) $\$ 700$ IF THE LICENSEE PROVIDES BOTH LIVE ENTERTAINMENT AND OUTDOOR TABLE OR CAFE SERVICE.
[(2)](3) In Baltimore City, the hours and days for sale for the license are as provided under $\S 11-503$ of this article.

7-101.
(d) (1) (i) A special Class C beer, wine and liquor license entitles the holder to exercise any of the privileges conferred by this class of license for the use of any person holding a bona fide entertainment conducted by a club, society, or association at the place described for a period not exceeding seven consecutive days, upon the payment of a fee of $\$ 15$ per day.
(ii) The provisions of § 11-517 of this article do not apply to holders of this license. Alcoholic beverages sold under this special license shall be purchased by such special license holder from retail dealers.
(3) In Baltimore City:
(i) The holder of a Class C special beer, wine and liquor license may purchase beer and light wine from a wholesale dealer.
(ii) The fee is:

1. $\$ 50$ per day IF THE CAPACITY OF THE LOCATION WHERE THE EVENT TO BE HELD IS DETERMINED BY THE BALTIMORE CITY FIRE DEPARTMENT TO BE LESS THAN 200 PERSONS;
2. $\$ 100$ PER DAY IF THE CAPACITY OF THE LOCATION WHERE THE EVENT TO BE HELD IS DETERMINED BY THE BALTIMORE City Fire Department to be 200 PERSONS OR GREATER BUT LESS THAN 1,000 PERSONS;
3. $\$ 500$ PER DAY IF THE CAPACITY OF THE LOCATION WHERE THE EVENT TO BE HELD IS DETERMINED BY THE BALTIMORE CITY FIRE DEPARTMENT TO BE 1,000 PERSONS OR GREATER BUT LESS THAN 10,000 PERSONS; OR
4. $\$ 1,000$ PER DAY IF THE CAPACITY OF THE LOCATION WHERE THE EVENT TO BE HELD IS DETERMINED BY THE BALTIMORE City Fire Department to be 10,000 PERSONS OR GREATER.

8-203.
(a) The provisions of this section only apply in Baltimore City.
(d) (1) There is a Class B-D-7 license.
(7) (I) All such licenses shall be issued by the Board of Liquor License Commissioners upon certification of the Board.
(II) The annual license fee is:

1. $\$ 1,320$ FOR A LICENSED ESTABLISHMENT WITH A SEATING CAPACITY OF 200 PERSONS OR LESS AS DETERMINED BY THE Baltimore City Fire Department; or
2. $\$ 3,000$ FOR A LICENSED ESTABLISHMENT WITH A SEATING CAPACITY GREATER THAN 200 PERSONS.
(III) IN ADDITION TO THE ANNUAL LICENSE FEE, THE LICENSEE SHALL PAY ANNUALLY:
3. $\$ 500$ IF THE LICENSEE PROVIDES LIVE ENTERTAINMENT;
4. $\$ 200$ IF THE LICENSEE PROVIDES OUTDOOR TABLE OR CAFE SERVICE; OR
5. $\quad \$ 700$ IF THE LICENSEE PROVIDES BOTH LIVE ENTERTAINMENT AND OUTDOOR TABLE OR CAFE SERVICE.
