## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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## State Board of Examiners of Psychologists - Criminal History Records Check

3 FOR the purpose of requiring applicants for a license to practice psychology to submit 4 to a certain criminal history records check; requiring applicants to submit 5 fingerprints and certain fees to the Criminal Justice Information System 6 Central Repository of the Department of Public Safety and Correctional 7 Services under certain circumstances; requiring the Central Repository to 8 forward certain information to the State Board of Examiners of Psychologists 9 and to certain applicants; providing that certain information is confidential and 10 may be used only for certain purposes; authorizing certain subjects to contest the contents of certain statements; requiring applicants for licensure to submit 11 12 certain evidence to the Board; requiring the Board to consider certain facts and 13 circumstances in determining whether to grant a license; prohibiting the Board 14 from issuing certain licenses if certain criminal history record information has 15 not been received; authorizing the Board to deny certain applicants a license for failure to submit to a certain criminal history records check; and generally 16 17 relating to criminal history records checks and the State Board of Examiners of 18 Psychologists.

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 2 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## 3 Article – Health Occupations

- 4 18–302.
- 5 (a) To qualify for a license, an applicant shall be an individual who meets the 6 requirements of this section.
- 7 (b) The applicant shall be of good moral character.
- 8 (c) The applicant shall be at least 18 years old.
- 9 (d) The applicant shall have a doctoral degree in psychology as defined in § 10—18–101(c) of this title.
- 11 (e) Except as otherwise provided in this subtitle, the applicant shall pass an examination given by the Board under this subtitle.
- 13 (f) The applicant shall have at least 2 years of professional supervised 14 experience in psychology that is approved by the Board in accordance with regulations 15 adopted by the Board.
- 16 (g) (1) Except as provided in this subsection, an applicant shall reside or 17 practice, or intend to reside or practice, in this State.
- 18 (2) The Board may issue a license to an applicant who is neither a 19 resident of this State nor practicing in this State if the applicant shows that issuing 20 the license would be in the interest of the citizens or government of this State.
- 21 (H) THE APPLICANT SHALL SUBMIT TO A CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS 22 CHECK IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 18–302.1 OF THIS SUBTITLE.

- 24 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "CENTRAL REPOSITORY" MEANS THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE INFORMATION SYSTEM CENTRAL REPOSITORY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND CORRECTIONAL SERVICES.
- 27 (B) AS PART OF AN APPLICATION TO THE CENTRAL REPOSITORY FOR A
  28 STATE AND NATIONAL CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS CHECK, AN APPLICANT
  29 SHALL SUBMIT TO THE CENTRAL REPOSITORY:

- 1 (1) TWO COMPLETE SETS OF LEGIBLE FINGERPRINTS TAKEN ON FORMS APPROVED BY THE DIRECTOR OF THE CENTRAL REPOSITORY AND THE DIRECTOR OF THE FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION;
- 4 (2) THE FEE AUTHORIZED UNDER § 10–221(B)(7) OF THE 5 CRIMINAL PROCEDURE ARTICLE FOR ACCESS TO STATE CRIMINAL HISTORY 6 RECORDS; AND
- 7 (3) THE PROCESSING FEE REQUIRED BY THE FEDERAL BUREAU 8 OF INVESTIGATION FOR A NATIONAL CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS CHECK.
- 9 (C) IN ACCORDANCE WITH §§ 10–201 THROUGH 10–228 OF THE CRIMINAL PROCEDURE ARTICLE, THE CENTRAL REPOSITORY SHALL FORWARD TO THE BOARD AND THE APPLICANT THE CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD INFORMATION OF THE APPLICANT.
- 13 (D) IF AN APPLICANT HAS MADE THREE OR MORE UNSUCCESSFUL
  14 ATTEMPTS AT SECURING LEGIBLE FINGERPRINTS, THE BOARD MAY ACCEPT AN
  15 ALTERNATE METHOD OF A CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS CHECK AS ALLOWED BY
  16 THE DIRECTOR OF THE CENTRAL REPOSITORY AND THE DIRECTOR OF THE
  17 FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION.

- 20 (1) SHALL BE CONFIDENTIAL;
- 21 (2) MAY NOT BE REDISSEMINATED; AND
- 22 (3) SHALL BE USED ONLY FOR THE LICENSING PURPOSE 23 AUTHORIZED BY THIS TITLE.

  THIS SECTION MAY CONTEST THE CONTENTS OF THE PRINTED STATEMENT
