13 14	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17	(a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.					
18 19	(2) "Collar" means a device constructed of nylon, leather, or simila material specifically designed to be used around the neck of a dog.					
20 21	(3) "Restraint" means a chain, rope, tether, leash, cable, or other device that attaches a dog to a stationary object or trolley system.					
22 23	(b) A person may not leave a dog outside and unattended by use of a restraint:					



1		(1)	that unreasonably limits the movement of the dog;			
2		(2)	that uses a collar that:			
3			(i) is	made primarily of metal; or		
4 5	plus 1 inch;		(ii) is	not at least as large as the circumference of the dog's neck

8		(4)	in unsafe	or unsanitary conditions; [or]

10 11	(6) DURING A SNOW EMERGENCY DECLARED BY THE MARYLAND STATE POLICE; OR					
12 13 14	(7) BETWEEN THE HOURS OF 10 P.M. AND 6 A.M., UNLESS THE PERSON HAS AN EXPRESS WAIVER FROM THE UNIT OF THE COUNTY OR MUNICIPAL CORPORATION THAT LICENSED THE DOG.					
15 16 17	(c) A person who violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and or conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 90 days or a fine not exceeding \$1,000 or both.					
18 19	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2010.
