A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Task Force on Solar Hot Water Systems in Prince George's County

3 FOR the purpose of establishing a Task Force on Solar Hot Water Systems in Prince 4 George's County; providing for the members of the Task Force; providing for the 5 designation of a chair of the Task Force; requiring the Prince George's County 6 government to provide staff for the Task Force; prohibiting a member of the 7 Task Force from receiving certain compensation; providing that a member of the 8 Task Force may receive reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Task 9 Force to study certain matters and make certain findings and recommendations; 10 requiring the Task Force to report its findings and recommendations to the Prince George's County Senators, the Prince George's County Delegation, and 11 12 the Prince George's County Council on or before a certain date; providing for the 13 termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Task Force on Solar Hot 14 Water Systems in Prince George's County.

- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 16 MARYLAND, That:
- 17 (a) There is a Task Force on Solar Hot Water Systems in Prince George's
 18 County to develop a business plan to achieve substantial use of solar hot water
 19 systems over a relatively short period of time in a way that saves money for Prince
 20 George's County residents and businesses and that reduces carbon emissions.

- 22 (1) one member of the Senate who represents Prince George's County, 23 appointed by the President of the Senate;
