- ON OR AFTER JULY 1, 2014, A PERSON MAY NOT SELL IN THE STATE
 NUMBER 2 HEATING OIL WITH A SULFUR CONTENT EXCEEDING 500 PARTS PER
 MILLION TO A CONSUMER FOR END USE.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 5 October 1, 2010.
