SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 Article – Environment

4 9–1108.

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- 5 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 6 (2) "Nitrogen removal technology" means the best available technology 7 for the removal of nitrogen.
- 8 (3) "On–site sewage disposal system" means a sewage treatment unit, 9 collection system, disposal area, and related appurtenances.
- 10 (b) A person may not:
- 11 (1) Install, or have installed, on property a person owns in the State in 12 the Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays Critical Area, an on—site sewage disposal 13 system to service a newly constructed building, unless the on—site sewage disposal 14 system utilizes nitrogen removal technology; or
- 15 (2) Replace or have replaced, an existing on–site sewage disposal 16 system on property a person owns in the State in the Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal 17 Bays Critical Area, unless the replacement on–site sewage disposal system utilizes 18 nitrogen removal technology.
- 19 (c) (1) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION AND IN accordance with § 9–1605.2(h) of this title, the Department shall assist homeowners in paying the cost difference between a conventional on—site sewage disposal system and a system that utilizes nitrogen removal technology with money from the Bay Restoration Fund, if sufficient funds are available.
- 24**(2)** IN CALENDAR YEARS 2010, 2011, AND 2012, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ASSIST HOMEOWNERS BY PAYING 100% OF THE COST 2526 DIFFERENCE BETWEEN A CONVENTIONAL ON-SITE SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEM 27 AND A SYSTEM THAT UTILIZES NITROGEN REMOVAL TECHNOLOGY WITH MONEY 28 FROM THE BAY RESTORATION FUND, IF THE HOMEOWNER:
- 29 (I) IS REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (B)(2) OF THIS
 30 SECTION TO REPLACE AN EXISTING ON-SITE SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEM WITH
 31 AN ON-SITE SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEM THAT UTILIZES NITROGEN REMOVAL
 32 TECHNOLOGY; AND
 - (II) HAS A FAILING ON-SITE SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEM.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except as provided by § 9–1108(c)(2) of the Environment Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, it is the intent of the General Assembly that the Department of the Environment may use an economic means test to determine the financial assistance awarded to a homeowner for the cost difference between a conventional on–site sewage disposal system and a system that utilizes nitrogen removal technology.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2010.
