10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (Limit Length to Visible area)

People's Community Health Center, Inc. (PCHC), a Federally Qualified Health Center, provides healthcare services to patients at seven clinics in Baltimore City and two sites in Anne Arundel County. Its mission is to provide high quality, comprehensive primary healthcare to all, regardless of ability to pay. PCHC is a pioneer of the prevention-oriented "medical home" model, providing a full range of cost-effective healthcare services. Five years ago, PCHC opened a health center in a small townhouse in Severn, the poorest area in Anne Arundel County, where residents suffer high rates of obesity, infant mortality, teen pregnancy, and HIV prevalence, a situation costing residents their lives and the state of Maryland the extraordinarily high costs associated with chronic disease. This bond requests funds for construction of the ground level, where the Boys & Girls Club of Annapolis & Anne Arundel County will provide afterschool services, improving health and educational outcomes. The project builds on both organizations' existing community investments, including collaborations with the Baltimore Washington Medical Center. PCHC bring federal funding to the county each year through Ryan White, pharmacy, and funding for the uninsured.

## 11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

The project is located at 1135 Reece Road, Severn, Maryland, 21144, across the street from the Van Bokkelyn school. A two-acre tract of land has been purchased and difficult zoning variance achieved (through 600 community support letters to the board). PCHC will construct a 20,243 sq. ft. "green" building consisting of one level that will provide health care and the ground level that will serve primarily as a community center. An atrium space will have social service utility and will be able to accommodate a community garden and youth area. The scope of work of this project will involve the detailed build-out of the terrace-level community center. This building will enable PCHC to serve 6000 patients and will be particularly important in providing after-hours care -- including mental health services-- to the military community (base clinic at Fort Meade closes at 4:30). Operational sustainability is assured through health center reimbursement mechanisms, and 75 short-term construction jobs and more than 50 permanent jobs will be created, all with local labor, stimulating the economy through increased purchasing power. The Boys & Girls Club provides a career preparation program of proven success, and PCHC will further strengthen the community through serving as a job training site for allied healthcare positions.

## 28. Comments: (Limit Length to Visible area)

People's Community Health Center is able to utilize health-center funding sources for construction of the upper health-center level, including the DHMH grant for Federally Qualified Health Centers and another DHMH grant available for substance abuse, etc. However, these sources do not allow funding of space to be used for the Boys & Girls Club, and it is for this reason that we are requesting the present Bond Bill.

It should be noted that a number of federal programs and much literature produced by the Institute of Medicine under the previous federal administration recognize that preventive health care for the major chronic diseases funded by tax payers is impossible without healthy community components, such as exercise programs, sources of fresh food, and centers such as the one we here propose. People's Community Health Center is aware of a number of emerging health-education reimbursement mechanisms that will likely be available to the Boys & Girls Club, which will further strengthen their operating budget. The collaboration between the organizations should allow for the future capture of new HUD funds for healthy communities that leverage anchor institutions (the so-called "meds and eds" cited in the planning document "Retooling HUD"). The project will become a replicable model nationwide, and will be visited by other communities seeking an integrated, fully leveraged model of development for the 21st century.

This community has a rapidly rising crime rate, and the Boys & Girls Club has ample evidence that their programs reduce gang activity, further contributing to cost savings for Maryland through investment in this project.

The school across from this site has a high rate of truancy and an unacceptable rate of graduation, and the Boys & Girls Club programs have been proven to have positive effects on both these statistics, further contributing to cost savings for Maryland taxpayers.

This project can accurately be viewed as a career ladder system, since the Boys & Girls Club features STEM programs in science and technology that will not only avoid delinquency but will allow Anne Arundel County employers to access talent that is needed for the jobs of the future.

People's Community Health Center will be able to offer jobs to disabled veterans and veterans seeking to convert their military medical training to civilian certifications and is developing partnerships to realize this plan.
