FISCAL AND POLICY NOTE

House Bill 462(Delegate Kaiser, *et al.*)Health and Government OperationsEducation, Health, and Environmental Affairs

Education - Discrimination Prohibited - Protected Classes

This bill conforms the provisions of law relating to discrimination in the employment of teachers in public schools to other provisions of State law governing discrimination in employment by adding ancestry, age, marital status, and sexual orientation as protected classes.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: Any administrative changes can be handled with existing resources.

Local Effect: Any administrative changes can be handled with existing resources.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law/Background: The State Superintendent of Schools, a local board of education, a local superintendent, or an assistant to any one of these may not make any distinction or discriminate in favor of or against any teacher in the employment of a public school of this State because of race, religion, color, national origin, handicap, or sex. There are exceptions for sex if employment of a certain sex is reasonably necessary because of the nature of the employment or for a handicap if the handicap adversely affects the person's ability to perform the duties of the position.

It is the policy of the State to assure all persons equal opportunity in receiving employment and in all labor management-union relations, regardless of race, color, religion, ancestry or national origin, sex, age, marital status, sexual orientation, or disability unrelated in nature and extent so as to reasonably preclude the performance of the employment.
