square-foot warehouse in Baltimore County. The new facility has allowed the Maryland Food Bank to accept more donations and provide better service to network partners across the state.

## 11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

Today, the Maryland Food Bank is the recognized heart of the food assistance structure in Maryland. We provide food to a network of 900 soup kitchens, food pantries, shelters and other community-based organizations across the state. We receive donations from a broad range of donors, including manufacturers, growers, retailers, wholesalers and individuals. We operate two facilities – an 87,000 square-foot warehouse in Baltimore County and a 12,500 square-foot warehouse in Wicomico County, which serves Maryland's Eastern Shore. At any one time our warehouses hold more than one million pounds of food. The Maryland Food Bank serves all of Maryland except Prince George's and Montgomery Counties, which are served by a sister food bank. Both the Maryland Food Bank and its sister organization are members of Feeding America (formerly America's Second Harvest), the nation's food bank network.

In Fiscal Year 2009, the Maryland Food Bank distributed 18.6 million pounds of food – a 30 percent increase from Fiscal Year 2008. Since Fiscal Year 2007, distribution has increased by nearly 60 percent.
