10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (Limit Length to Visible area)

Communities Organized to Improve Life, Inc. (COIL) is a non-profit organization dedicated to improving the overall health and well-being of the residents of the communities of Southwest and West Baltimore. Its mission is to involve neighborhood people in devising solutions for the physical, economic and social issues facing the Southwest and West Communities of Baltimore City.

Communities Organized to Improve Life, Inc. proposes to support and strengthen academic opportunities, senior citizen quality of life and family support services rendered to the youth, seniors and families of Southwest Baltimore by facilitating a collaborative coordination of these activities with the community and the Baltimore City human service systems. The proposed project will enable the expansion of coordinated community based youth, senior, and family support services.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

Factors such as drug abuse, HIV and AIDS, parent incarceration, poverty, child abuse and neglect, illiteracy and youth and family homelessness have caused many households to be torn apart resulting in Baltimore's children failing both socially and academically and seniors being overwhelmed with having to head these such households with little or no resources or supports. Communities Organized to Improve Life, Inc. seeks to address these factors by facilitating the implementation of a multifaceted holistic approach to youth and senior coordination of services. Currently, there are no collaboratives or facilities of this kind in the catchment area that offer this type of holistic coordination in specific with a senior inter generational model.

The monies requested will go to the renovation of our current property located at 1200 West Baltimore to expand senior, youth and family member services. The total square footage of the building to be renovated is 27,172 square feet and Communities Organized to Improve Life, Inc. proposes to have the building renovated by August of 2011. This project will serve an additional 500 people annually and create 72 jobs.
