## 11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

The purpose of the grant will to be support expenses related to the physical renovation of the Druid Hill Family Center Y. The improvements, including upgraded gym, lobby area, locker rooms, teen center and computer lab, will greatly enhance the Y's ability to deliver quality programs and increase the number of members, from young children to aging older adults, who are served.

Due to the large number of participants receiving financial assistance for wellness programming, and the continued commitment to offer young people a wide range of programs at no fee, the Druid Hill Family Center Y incurs operating losses each year. This financial cycle has not allowed for reinvestment into the physical structure, and as a result, has limited the Y's ability to expand and improve its programs and services.

## 28. Comments: (Limit Length to Visible area)

The Druid Hill Family Center Y, established in 1885, was created by Baltimore's African American community as a vibrant center for socialization, recreation and business. For over 120 years, this neighborhood Y has provided the youth in the Upton/Druid Heights community with a safe, positive place to spend out-of-school time, and it has offered people of all ages opportunities to engage in programs and activities that positively impact their overall wellness.

Today, this center serves as a traditional Family Center Y offering health and wellness services and programs; including those specially designed for older adults. It also serves as an anchor of vitally important Y youth and family strengthening services which address critical social needs in an under-served area of Baltimore City. This Center is the headquarters for the Y's Youth Asset Development programs which reach thousands of at-risk youth in locations throughout Baltimore City with an array of positive programs providing safety before and after school, academic support, cultural enrichment, exercise and the daily involvement of responsible, caring adult role models.

Additionally hundreds of children and youth come to the Druid Hill Family Center Y daily for direct service, programs and activities that build healthy spirit mind and body, including:

-Success Academy, an innovative partnership with Baltimore City Schools that helps chronically suspended youth positively re-engage with their school, family and community. (Teaches life skills at the Y  $\frac{1}{2}$  day and academics in school  $\frac{1}{2}$  day)

-New Horizons, a camp for homeless teens which provides a safe haven during the summer daytime hours when shelters are closed and school is not in session. New Horizons participants learn life skills and enjoy work-site internships.

Despite having so much to offer, including some strong and important partnerships, more is needed to properly serve this community. The Y of Central Maryland is committed to assuring this center's vital future but cannot do it alone.

Improvement of the Druid Hill Family Center Y will greatly enhance Y staff and volunteer's ability to provide a higher quality wellness experience to community members, and will allow the Y to attract additional funding partners who can support delivery of critical mission programming.
