10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (Limit Length to Visible area)

Port Discovery Children's Museum provides a safe, fun, and nurturing place where all children and families can learn and play together through experiences that ignite imagination, inspire learning, and nurture growth through play. The Museum plays a vital role in providing "play to learn" experiences that lay the groundwork not only for academic success but also for lifelong learning. With an annual attendance of approximately 250,000 and a total attendance of over 2.8 million visitors over the past 11 years, Port Discovery ranks in the top ten of over 300 children's museums in the country and is one of the most visited family destinations in the Baltimore area. Port Discovery is truly distinctive in Maryland because it focuses entirely on children from birth to age ten and offers age-appropriate activities designed to awaken each child's imagination, creativity, and talents. All of the Museum's exhibits and programs correlate to Maryland's curriculum standards. Museum services include structured school visits, state-subsidized admissions for school groups, after-school programs, free and low-cost community-based programs, and family memberships.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)
Port Discovery Children's Museum's Green Renovation Project is being implemented over a 10-year period with a final goal of LEED certification in 2017. The Museum is housed in the Fish Market Building, a 102 year old building that requires additional planning and upkeep due to its historic qualities. The project is divided up into six parts. The Museum is currently designing Phase 1 projects and constructing and installing them. These include: a new HVAC system (to be completed in FY2012); the expansion and redesign of the Museum's infant-toddler exhibit (to be completed in FY2011); and the weatherization of the Museum's entrance including the replacement of lobby doors (to be completed in FY2011).

The Museum's role as a learning and cultural institutions uniquely positions it to leverage the renovations to increase educational, cultural, and recreational opportunities for children. Over the course of the ten-year initiative, over 2.6 million people will visit the Museum. Signage will be created throughout the Museum explaining the renovations and how they promote sustainability. Sustainability and green development will also be featured in programs related to STEM (science, technology, engineering, math) and health. The Museum will also leverage its highly visible location on President Street to promote green building to the millions of commuters that pass by it each year.
