Ducks Unlimited is a nonprofit conservation founded in 1937 that is dedicated to the protection and restoration of wetlands—one of nature's most productive ecosystems. For more than 70 years, we have conserved more than 12 million acres of wetland habitats across North America. While our primary purpose is to help waterfowl, the wetland ecosystems we protect and restore also benefit fish, other wildlife, and people. Since 1989, Ducks Unlimited has restored over 50,000								

acres of critical wildlife habitat in Maryland. These projects have helped not only waterfowl but over 900 species of wildlife, including many endangered species. Finally, Ducks Unlimited has

more than 780,000 members, including nearly 13,000 in Maryland.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

Ducks Unlimited will use this funding for two projects at Blackwater National Wildlife Refuge in Dorchester County. The Refuge consists of over 25,000 acres of tidal salt marsh, freshwater ponds, forest and cropland. The Refuge supports a diversity of wildlife including the endangered Delmarva Fox Squirrel, American Bald Eagle, and migrant Peregrine Falcon. The Refuge is also a crucial wintering area for waterfowl in the Atlantic Flyway and has been identified as an area of high priority conservation concern by the Atlantic Coast Joint Venture Mid-Atlantic conservation region. The requested funding is for the survey and design of a restoration project that will enhance two existing wetlands currently totaling 12 acres. This will be done by sculpting surrounding hydric soils, allowing the flooding of an additional 33.4 acres of wetland habitat. In addition to increasing the acreage available to flood, this project will partially fill in existing drainage ditches, in turn decreasing the amount of water needed to flood each wetland. The second project will replace a faulty water control structure, which controls the water flow into a 75 acre wetland on the refuge. The proposed project will allow Refuge personnel to more efficiently manage a 75-acre wetland and enhance the value of this wetland to wildlife.
