<p>The Largo High School Parent Teacher Student Association (PTSA) is a non-profit volunteer organization that works with the School Board, School Faculty, Parents and Students advocating the best for our students to be safe, healthy and successful in school and in life.</p>				

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

Our original track surface is over 35 years old and has been resurfaced once since 2000. This stadium track is used by our community during non-sport seasons and each weekday afternoon when there is no sport training meet. The field brings neighbors together and generates an exercising family of fellowship by each parent, adult and children that come along to watch. Each community member is very active in keeping the track clean and free of debris on, around, and near the track and field. The foundation is uneven from sections of asphalt that have either worn away or have completely separated from the original foundation. There are uneven elevated and eroded sections on the interior of the track that have resulted in unsafe thoroughfares from the playing field to the track. As a community school, we want to make certain that our facility can accommodate the volume of activity we host on a weekly basis. We want to be assured that our facility is operating at a standard that goes beyond the levels of adequacy and can meet and exceed the operational safety requirements in such a diversely aged and gendered constituency.

As a community school, we want to make certain that our facility can accommodate the volume of activity we host on a weekly basis. We want to be assured that our facility is operating at a standard that goes beyond the levels of adequacy and can meet and exceed the operational safety requirements in such a diversely aged and gendered constituency.

For the county schools that are operating with certain amenities, these schools tend to have higher rates of student participation in athletics.

If there are higher participation rates in student athletes then it is fair to assume that these student/athletes are attaining the county eligibility requirements. These are also the schools that are solicited when outside groups wish to hold events. Being able to accommodate a variety of outside groups will afford Largo High the luxury of securing funds to be used in its operational budget. As stated before, Largo High School is located in the northern region of Upper Marlboro and we are centrally located in the heart of Prince George's County.

We would like to be able to supplement our operating costs with the fees that are collected when outside groups wish to use the facility.

Presently, this is not an option due to the current conditions. We are also afforded the opportunity to host internal events for the county or school. These funds not only compensate the school, we have made certain that we are insuring the cost of repair, promoting longevity of the facility by holding outside groups accountable and instituting a universal policy and procedure for facility usage. In order to achieve this, we must be able to provide a product that is qualified to request the allocation of fees for rental. When these fees are collected we ensure the upkeep of the facility.
