10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (Limit Length to Visible area)				
<p>The Ivy Community Charities of Prince George's County Inc are a 501c3 organization that is part of the Alpha Kappa Alpha sorority group of Prince George's County Maryland and they support the educational charitable, cultural and general welfare of economically and socially disadvantaged residents of Prince George's County. The organization uses a clubhouse facility in the Marleigh community to host meetings that are a benefit to the organization, community, and surrounding neighborhoods. This would include working with youths as well as other groups. Kappa Alpha Psi inc, is also a 501c3 organization that works to improve the lives of citizens within Prince George's County. This organization utilizes the clubhouse in Marleigh as well for community meetings and assists the residents of Marleigh in functions such as community clean up days. The security camera would keep these members safe and if a crime was committed in the community the camera would be able to capture the suspect(s) as they fled the Marleigh community.</p>				

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

The project would consist of a camera and surveillance system that would utilize state of the art cameras and digital video recorders (DVR) to capture vehicular and pedestrian traffic as it entered and exited the Marleigh community. The system has multiple cameras with day/night capability and a license plate tag reader that can capture video footage of suspected vehicles or persons involved in criminal activity. The video footage is captured by a digital video recorder and saved to a DVD in case of a crime occurring within the neighborhood and that DVD is forwarded to law enforcement for further use in making an arrest. The camera system would have flashing lights and high intensity flood lights to capture video and also to deter criminals from entering into the community. The camera system is within a self contained unit and this is in response to a gruesome home invasion murder in the community and the residents being gripped with fear.
