10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (Limit Length to Visible area)

The mission of The Pocomoke City Volunteer Fire Company is to protect the lives and property of Pocomoke City and its surrounding area, through emergency response, education and prevention. In addition, the Company and its Ladies Auxiliary have provided a meeting hall for community organizations, civic clubs, churches, schools and even private citizens to raise funds or celebrate special occasions. The fund raising "chicken and dumpling" dinners prepared by the volunteers of the Ladies Auxiliary are legendary in this area. The rates for the old building were affordable and not intended to be a profit builder for the company--only to all cover maintenance and administrative costs. The meeting area was open to all responsible parties or organizations without discrimination. Its only limitations were parking--none available except through the courtesy of the owner of a neighboring business center--and handicapped access--two flights of steps. These problems will be corrected in the new center.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

The proposed new facility, which will accomodate up to 475 people, will continue to provide an excellent and affordable meeting place for the community, its varied organizations and citizens. In addition to Fire Company events, it will host award ceremonies for Pocomoke High School athletes as well as the schools prom; fund raising dinners for The Pocomoke River Discovery Center, The Sturgis One-Room School Museum, the Marva Theater Performing Arts Center and many other community and private events. The wonderful volunteers of the Ladies Auxiliary will be able to work their culinary magic in a new state of the art kitchen. The parking problems of the former hall will be resolved by plenty of on-site parking and the new center "all on the first floor" will be in full ADA compliance. The center will also be available as a shelter, in case of an emergency. The Fire Company pledges to continue its policy of nominal rental fees and equal opportunity access.
