# Baltimore City - 46th District - Alcoholic Beverages - Issuance or Transfer of Licenses Prohibited in Certain Precincts - Food Sales

This bill prohibits the Baltimore City Board of License Commissioners from issuing alcoholic beverages licenses in, or the transfer of licenses into, precincts 7 through 16, inclusive, of the 25th ward in the 46th Alcoholic Beverages District of Baltimore City.

The bill also lowers, from 65% to 60%, the percentage of average daily receipts derived from food sales required of licensed (Class B beer, wine, and liquor) restaurants in ward, 26, precinct 8; ward 4, precinct 1; ward 3, precinct 3; or ward 22, precinct 1 of the 46th Alcoholic Beverages District in Baltimore City, provided they meet specified seating capacity and capital investment requirements.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2010.

## **Fiscal Summary**

State Effect: None.

**Local Effect:** None. The bill does not significantly affect the operations or finances of the Baltimore City Board of License Commissioners.

**Small Business Effect:** Potential meaningful impact on some restaurants in Baltimore City to the extent lowering the food/beverage ratio enables them to remain in business.

### **Analysis**

Current Law: The Baltimore City Board of License Commissioners may issue a Class B beer, wine, and liquor license for use in a restaurant that has a seating capacity exceeding 150 persons if the restaurant: (1) is located in ward 26, precinct 8; ward 4, precinct 1; or ward 3, precinct 3 of the 46th Alcoholic Beverages District; (2) has a minimum capital investment of \$700,000; and (3) has average daily receipts from the sale of food that are at least 65% of the total daily receipts.

The board may also issue a Class B beer, wine, and liquor license for use in a restaurant that has a seating capacity exceeding 75 persons if the restaurant: (1) is located in ward 4, precinct 1; or ward 22, precinct 1 of the 46th Alcoholic Beverages District; (2) has a minimum capital investment of \$700,000; (3) has average daily receipts from the sale of food that are at least 65% of the total daily receipts; and (4) has no sales for off-premises consumption.
