10. Desc	10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (Limit Length to Visible area)								
Augsburg Lutheran Home of Maryland Inc. is a 501(c)(3) organization incorporated in the State of Maryland. It serves primarily low income seniors, without regard to religious affiliation. Augsburg is governed by a 30-member Board of Directors and has 250 employees. On Augsburg's 51 acre campus, residents live in one of three distinct retirement environments: 138 independent living apartments, 64 assisted-living rooms, and a traditional comprehensive nursing care center that serves 123 people. In the nursing care center - the subject of this bond bill request - residents are admitted from Augsburg's other settings and directly from the community. Their expenses are supported by Medicaid (70 -75%), Medicare (10%), with some private paid. The capital project supports Augsburg's goal to create culture of aging in a neighborhood-style setting that is life-affirming and meaningful, facilitating patient outcomes that have medical, social and cognitive benefits.									

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

The capital project will renovate the current three-floor nursing care center and construct a new three-floor, 36,375 sq. ft. addition, creating an expanded nursing care center with a spatial capacity of 54,875 sq.ft. The new design will create six distinct "neighborhoods" serving 17-24 residents with mostly private rooms living family-style in each neighborhood. A neighborhood will function like a home, with a kitchen and dining and visiting areas for residents. The lower floor allows space for a 3,150 sq. ft. multipurpose area and office complex to be at a completed later date. The new nursing care center will employ the progressive culture change approach in our 123-resident program, transforming its organization from a traditional institutional model to a person-centered care model. Augsburg is taking a leadership position in the State of Maryland, and in the industry, in its recognition that patient-directed nursing home communities (called a culture change model) - currently implemented only in private, well-to-do nursing homes - can be, and should be adopted in settings for Medicaid patients.

Augsburg Lutheran Home & Village is taking a leadership role in the State of Maryland by implementing a culture change model, a progressive national movement in long term care. It will be the first facility of its kind in Maryland using this model, usually only available for the wealthy, in a setting for Medicaid patients.

Augsburg's expanded and reconfigured nursing care center creates a culture of aging that is lifeaffirming and meaningful. It is a culture of greater respect for its aged residents and their caretakers, facilitating a new style of care that better meets residents' medical, emotional and psycho/social needs. It ensures that residents have greater privacy, input and self-determination, and it promotes greater teamwork among employees and consistent care that builds stronger relationships among residents, caretakers and families, and empowers caretakers with decisionmaking responsibilities. The Augsburg staff will use all aspects of the new setting -- physical, organizational, psycho-social and spiritual – to build stronger relationships among residents, caretakers and families.
