#### 10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (Limit Length to Visible area)

The Garrett Park Nursery School is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization. Since 1953, it has operated a high quality pre-school program out of the Garrett Park Community Center building (formerly the Garrett Park Estates Activity Building). The Garrett Park Nursery School is licensed by the Montgomery County Office of Child Care and approved by the Maryland State Department of Education. It currently serves children ages two, three, and four, with separate classes for each group. As a cooperative nursery school, the program is parent-owned and operated and involves the active participation of member families. Although based out of the Town of Garrett Park, the school serves neighboring communities, such as Kensington, Silver Spring, Garrett Park Estates/ White Flint Park, Bethesda, and Rockville. It also has a tuition-assistance program for lower income families.

#### 11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

The Garrett Park Community Center building has a rich history. It was built in the late 1940s and early 1950s as part of a unique arrangement between the Town of Garrett Park and the Maryland National Capital Park and Planning Commission. The Garrett Park Nursery School, its primary tenant for over 50 years, seeks to renovate and preserve the structurally sound building. The renovation will include: renovating the roof to address code and safety issues; improving the site by addressing water infiltration and drainage issues through grading; altering configuration of current bathroom and entrance to allow adequate handicapped access; and replacing windows to address water infiltration, energy efficiency, and minor lead paint and asbestos issues.

Once renovated, the building will continue to serve as the home of the Garrett Park Nursery School but will also be available to community groups such as the Girl Scouts and Boy Scouts. In addition, the Nursery School plans to provide additional programs for the community or sub-lease the building to make it available to other groups that will do so.

#### 28. Comments: (Limit Length to Visible area)

Item 11: Renovating the Garrett Park Community Center will enable the Garrett Park Nursery School not only to continue to educate the community's young children, but also to serve the community through the development of additional programs from older children and families.

Item16: The total of 120 current users is a very conservative estimate. The Community Center building currently serves the students and families of the Garrett Park Nursery School. Each year there are approximately 40 students and 35 different families (with at least one co-oping parent) served by the school. In addition, three girl scout troops currently use the building, with each troop having approximately 15 scouts, for a total of 45 scouts. This total does not include the other scout and Nursery School family members who make use of the building or anyone else who makes use of the building or attached playground.

Item 17: The total of "220 plus" in Item 17 is likewise a conservative estimate intended to convey that additional people will use the building after the renovation. The number of students at the Nursery School will remain constant but we anticipate other groups including, scout troops and Town of Garrett Park committees, to make use of the building. Moreover, when the Nursery School expands its programming, it will be able to serve additional persons and populations in the renovated building.

Item 25 E: The current owner of the Garrett Park Community Center (also known as the Garrett Park Estates Activity Building) is the Maryland National Capital Park and Planning Commission. MNCPPC has offered to transfer ownership of the building to the Town of Garrett Park. MNCPPC is in negotiations with the Town of Garrett Park regarding the details of the transfer. The Town has entered into a Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") with the Garrett Park Nursery School which documents the Town's intention to enter into a long term lease (no less than 15 years) with the Nursery School for use of the Community Center.
