11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

During the snow/ice mega-storm in early February 2010, two buildings at the St. Mary's County Fairgrounds collapsed. One is the 4-H exhibit building (2400 sq.ft.). The other is the Livestock Show-ring (5000 sq.ft.). The purpose of this project is to replace these vital buildings.

The Fairground is an important agricultural icon in St. Mary's County. Each year there are 120,000 visits to the Fairground. Approximately half of these visits are during the County Fair, where visitors can see livestock up close, and 4-Hers completing their projects. The other 60,000 visits are for various community events, such as the Crab Festival, Oyster Festival, Spring Festival, and Southern Maryland Invitational Livestock Show, which raise thousands of dollars for local charities. The 4-H livestock auction at the County Fair alone raised in the order of \$90,000 for 4-H participants.
