$\begin{array}{c} 11 \\ 12 \end{array}$	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
13	Article – Election Law
14	10–301.1.
15 16	(a) Except as provided under Title 9, Subtitle 3 of this article, during any regularly scheduled primary or general election a voter may vote:
17	(1) in the voter's assigned precinct on election day; or
18 19	(2) at an early voting center in the voter's county of residence on any early voting day in accordance with this section.
20 21	(b) (1) Each county shall have at least one early voting center established in the county as prescribed in this subsection.

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW. [Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.



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$\frac{1}{2}$	(2) A county with fewer than 150,000 registered voters shall have one early voting center established in the county.
$\frac{3}{4}$	(3) A county with more than 150,000 but fewer than 300,000 registered voters shall have three early voting centers established in the county.
$5 \\ 6$	(4) A county with more than 300,000 registered voters shall have five early voting centers established in the county.
7 8 9	(c) No later than 6 months before a primary election, the State Board, in collaboration with the local board in each county, shall designate each early voting center in that county.
10	(d) Each early voting center shall be open for voting [as follows:
11	(1) for the 2010 gubernatorial primary and general elections:
12 13	(i) beginning the second Friday before a primary or general election through the Thursday before the elections, but excluding Sunday; and
14	(ii) during the hours between 10 a.m. and 8 p.m.; and
15	(2) for the 2012 presidential primary and general elections:
16 17	(i) beginning the second Saturday before a primary or general election through the Thursday before the elections; and
18 19	(ii) 1. during the hours between 10 a.m. and 8 p.m. on the Saturday and the Monday through the Thursday during the early voting period; and

28 29 30	(f) Beginning 30 days prior to each early voting period the State Board and each local board shall undertake steps to inform the public about early voting and the location of early voting centers in each county, including:
31	(1) a series of public service media announcements;

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- 1 (2) mailings to all registered voters in each county; and
- 2 (3) other measures as appropriate.

3 (g) Except as expressly provided in this section, any provision of this article 4 that applies to voting on election day also applies to early voting.

5 (h) The State Board shall adopt regulations and guidelines in accordance 6 with the requirements of this section for the conduct of early voting.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectJuly 1, 2011.
