BY adding to Article – State Finance and Procurement Section 14–411 Annotated Code of Maryland (2009 Replacement Volume and 2010 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - State Finance and Procurement 14-411. IN THIS SECTION, "PUBLIC EMPLOYER" MEANS: (A) **(1)** A UNIT; **(2)** A COUNTY; **(3)** A MUNICIPALITY IN THE STATE;

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1	(4) A SCHOOL DISTRICT IN THE STATE; OR
2	(5) ANY SPECIAL DISTRICT IN THE STATE.
3	(B) (1) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SECTION, A
4	PUBLIC EMPLOYER MAY NOT KNOWINGLY BUY, FURNISH, OR REQUIRE AN
5	EMPLOYEE TO BUY OR ACQUIRE FOR USE WHILE ON DUTY ANY OF THE
6	FOLLOWING ITEMS UNLESS THE ITEM IS MANUFACTURED IN THE UNITED

28	(3) THE BOARD SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS DEFINING THE
29	FOLLOWING TERMS FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION:
30	(I) "REASONABLY AVAILABLE";

"UNREASONABLE AMOUNT"; AND

(II)

(III) "SUBSTANTIALLY LESS".

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be construed to apply only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have any effect on or application to any contract for the procurement of uniforms, safety equipment, or protective accessories entered into by a public employer before the effective date of this Act.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2011.
