Nonpublic Schools Accepting State Funds – Bullying, Harassment, and Intimidation – Policies

4 FOR the purpose of requiring nonpublic schools that accept State funds to adopt a 5 policy prohibiting bullying, harassment, and intimidation by a certain date; 6 requiring the policy to include certain provisions; encouraging a nonpublic 7 school to develop the policy in consultation with certain groups; encouraging a 8 nonpublic school to publicize the policy in a certain manner; encouraging a 9 nonpublic school to develop certain educational programs in its efforts to prevent bullying, harassment, and intimidation; providing that certain 10 nonpublic school employees who report acts of bullying, harassment, or 11 12 intimidation are not civilly liable under certain circumstances; providing that this Act may not be construed to limit the legal rights of a victim of bullying, 13 harassment, or intimidation; defining certain terms; and generally relating to 14 15 policies prohibiting bullying, harassment, and intimidation in nonpublic schools 16 that accept State funds.

WHEREAS, The National Institutes of Health reports that bullying affects more than 5 million students in grades 6 through 11; and



- 1 WHEREAS, According to the United States Department of Health and Human 2 Services, bullies identified by age 8 are six times more likely to have criminal 3 convictions by age 24; and 4 WHEREAS, The increased use of the Internet by students is presenting new 5 challenges regarding bullying in schools; and 6 WHEREAS, Bullying may lead to an increase in absenteeism or the dropout 7 rate; and WHEREAS, Maintaining a safe environment in schools is integral to promoting 8 9 learning and success in students; now, therefore, SECTION 1. - 4 (9) Information about the types of support services 5 Available to a student bully or victim and any bystanders.
- 6 (D) A NONPUBLIC SCHOOL IS ENCOURAGED TO DEVELOP THE POLICY
 7 ADOPTED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION IN CONSULTATION WITH
 8 THE FOLLOWING GROUPS:
- 9 (1) PARENTS OR GUARDIANS OF STUDENTS;
- 10 (2) SCHOOL EMPLOYEES AND ADMINISTRATORS;
- 11 (3) SCHOOL VOLUNTEERS; AND
- 12 **(4)** STUDENTS.
- 13 (E) A NONPUBLIC SCHOOL IS ENCOURAGED TO PUBLICIZE THE POLICY
- 14 ADOPTED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION IN STUDENT HANDBOOKS,
- 15 ON THE SCHOOL'S WEBSITE, AND ANY OTHER LOCATION OR VENUE THE SCHOOL
- 16 DETERMINES IS NECESSARY OR APPROPRIATE.
- 17 (F) A NONPUBLIC SCHOOL IS ENCOURAGED TO DEVELOP THE
- 18 FOLLOWING EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS IN ITS EFFORTS TO PREVENT BULLYING,
- 19 HARASSMENT, AND INTIMIDATION:
- 20 (1) AN EDUCATIONAL BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND
- 21 INTIMIDATION PREVENTION PROGRAM FOR STUDENTS, STAFF, VOLUNTEERS,
- 22 AND PARENTS; AND
- 23 (2) A TEACHER AND ADMINISTRATOR DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM
- 24 THAT TRAINS TEACHERS AND ADMINISTRATORS TO IMPLEMENT THE POLICY
- 25 ADOPTED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION.
- 26 (G) AN EMPLOYEE OF A NONPUBLIC SCHOOL WHO REPORTS AN ACT OF
- 27 BULLYING, HARASSMENT, OR INTIMIDATION IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE
- 28 NONPUBLIC SCHOOL'S POLICY ADOPTED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS
- 29 SECTION IS NOT CIVILLY LIABLE FOR ANY ACT OR OMISSION IN REPORTING OR
- 30 FAILING TO REPORT AN ACT OF BULLYING, HARASSMENT, OR INTIMIDATION IN
- 31 ACCORDANCE WITH THE POLICY.

- 1 (H) THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION MAY NOT BE CONSTRUED TO 2 LIMIT THE LEGAL RIGHTS OF A VICTIM OF BULLYING, HARASSMENT, OR 3 INTIMIDATION.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 5 July 1, 2011.
