CHAPTER

- 1 AN ACT concerning
- Nonpublic Schools Accepting State Funds Participating in State-Funded

 Education Programs Bullying, Harassment, and Intimidation Policies
- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring nonpublic schools that accept State funds participate in 5 State-funded education programs to adopt a policy prohibiting bullying, 6 harassment, and intimidation by a certain date; requiring the policy to include 7 certain provisions; encouraging a nonpublic school to develop the policy in 8 consultation with certain groups; encouraging a nonpublic school to publicize 9 the policy in a certain manner; encouraging a nonpublic school to develop 10 certain educational programs in its efforts to prevent bullying, harassment, and intimidation; providing that certain nonpublic school employees who report acts 11 12 of bullying, harassment, or intimidation are not civilly liable under certain 13 circumstances; providing that this Act may not be construed to limit the legal 14 rights of a victim of bullying, harassment, or intimidation; defining certain 15 terms; and generally relating to policies prohibiting bullying, harassment, and 16 intimidation in nonpublic schools that accept State funds participate in 17 State-funded education programs.

4 5 6	WHEREAS, According to the United States Department of Health and Human Services, bullies identified by age 8 are six times more likely to have criminal convictions by age 24; and
7 8	WHEREAS, The increased use of the Internet by students is presenting new challenges regarding bullying in schools; and
9 10	WHEREAS, Bullying may lead to an increase in absenteeism or the dropout rate; and

19 20 21	(2) "BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND INTIMIDATION" MEANS ANY INTENTIONAL WRITTEN, VERBAL, OR PHYSICAL ACT, INCLUDING AN ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATION, THAT:
22	(I) 1. PHYSICALLY HARMS AN INDIVIDUAL;
23	2. DAMAGES AN INDIVIDUAL'S PROPERTY;
24 25	3. SUBSTANTIALLY INTERFERES WITH AN INDIVIDUAL'S EDUCATION OR LEARNING ENVIRONMENT; OR
26 27	4. PLACES AN INDIVIDUAL IN REASONABLE FEAR OF HARM TO THE INDIVIDUAL'S PERSON OR PROPERTY; AND
28 29	(II) 1. OCCURS ON SCHOOL PROPERTY, AT A SCHOOL ACTIVITY OR EVENT, OR ON A SCHOOL BUS; OR

- 3 (3) "ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATION" MEANS A COMMUNICATION
- 4 TRANSMITTED BY MEANS OF AN ELECTRONIC DEVICE, INCLUDING A
- 5 TELEPHONE, CELLULAR PHONE, COMPUTER, OR PAGER.
- 6 (4) "NONPUBLIC SCHOOL" MEANS A NONPUBLIC SCHOOL THAT
- 7 ACCEPTS STATE FUNDS PARTICIPATES IN STATE-FUNDED EDUCATION
- 8 PROGRAMS.
- 9 (5) "STANDARD" MEANS WITHIN EACH SCHOOL.
- 10 **(B)** By March 31, 2012, Each nonpublic school shall adopt a Policy prohibiting bullying, Harassment, and intimidation.
- 12 (C) THE POLICY ADOPTED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION 13 SHALL INCLUDE:

- 23 (4) STANDARD CONSEQUENCES AND REMEDIAL ACTIONS FOR
- 24 PERSONS COMMITTING ACTS OF BULLYING, HARASSMENT, OR INTIMIDATION
- 25 AND FOR PERSONS ENGAGED IN REPRISAL OR RETALIATION, INCLUDING:
- 26 (I) SPECIFIC PENALTIES FOR PERSONS WHO REPEATEDLY
- 27 COMMIT ACTS OF BULLYING, HARASSMENT, OR INTIMIDATION; AND
- 28 (II) A REQUIREMENT THAT PERSONS WHO COMMIT ACTS OF
- 29 BULLYING, HARASSMENT, OR INTIMIDATION RECEIVE EDUCATIONAL AND
- 30 THERAPEUTIC SERVICES CONCERNING BULLYING PREVENTION;
- 31 (5) STANDARD CONSEQUENCES AND REMEDIAL ACTIONS FOR
- 32 PERSONS FOUND TO HAVE MADE FALSE ACCUSATIONS;

- 1 (6) STANDARD PROCEDURES FOR REPORTING ACTS OF BULLYING, HARASSMENT, OR INTIMIDATION, INCLUDING A CHAIN OF COMMAND 3 IN THE REPORTING PROCESS;
- 4 (7) STANDARD PROCEDURES FOR THE PROMPT INVESTIGATION 5 OF ACTS OF BULLYING, HARASSMENT, OR INTIMIDATION;
- 6 (8) STANDARD PROCEDURES FOR PROTECTING VICTIMS OF BULLYING, HARASSMENT, OR INTIMIDATION FROM ADDITIONAL ACTS OF BULLYING, HARASSMENT, OR INTIMIDATION, AND FROM RETALIATION; AND
- 9 **(9)** Information about the types of support services 10 Available to a student bully or victim and any bystanders.
- 11 (D) A NONPUBLIC SCHOOL IS ENCOURAGED TO DEVELOP THE POLICY
 12 ADOPTED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION IN CONSULTATION WITH
 13 THE FOLLOWING GROUPS:
- 14 (1) PARENTS OR GUARDIANS OF STUDENTS;
- 15 (2) SCHOOL EMPLOYEES AND ADMINISTRATORS;
- 16 (3) SCHOOL VOLUNTEERS; AND
- 17 **(4)** STUDENTS.
- 18 **(E)** A NONPUBLIC SCHOOL IS ENCOURAGED TO PUBLICIZE THE POLICY
 19 ADOPTED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION IN STUDENT HANDBOOKS,
 20 ON THE SCHOOL'S WEBSITE, AND ANY OTHER LOCATION OR VENUE THE SCHOOL
 21 DETERMINES IS NECESSARY OR APPROPRIATE.
- 22 (F) A NONPUBLIC SCHOOL IS ENCOURAGED TO DEVELOP THE 23 FOLLOWING EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS IN ITS EFFORTS TO PREVENT BULLYING, 24 HARASSMENT, AND INTIMIDATION:
- 25 (1) AN EDUCATIONAL BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND 26 INTIMIDATION PREVENTION PROGRAM FOR STUDENTS, STAFF, VOLUNTEERS, 27 AND PARENTS; AND
- 28 **(2)** A TEACHER AND ADMINISTRATOR DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM
 29 THAT TRAINS TEACHERS AND ADMINISTRATORS TO IMPLEMENT THE POLICY
 30 ADOPTED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION.
- 31 (G) AN EMPLOYEE OF A NONPUBLIC SCHOOL WHO REPORTS AN ACT OF 32 BULLYING, HARASSMENT, OR INTIMIDATION IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE

NONPUBLIC SCHOOL'S POLICY ADOPTED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS
SECTION IS NOT CIVILLY LIABLE FOR ANY ACT OR OMISSION IN REPORTING OR
FAILING TO REPORT AN ACT OF BULLYING, HARASSMENT, OR INTIMIDATION IN
ACCORDANCE WITH THE POLICY.
(H) THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION MAY NOT BE CONSTRUED TO
LIMIT THE LEGAL RIGHTS OF A VICTIM OF BULLYING, HARASSMENT, OR
INTIMIDATION.
SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2011.
