18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

- 19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Courts and Judicial Proceedings

- 21 3-8C-01.
- 22 This subtitle applies only:

(1) In a county in which the circuit administrative judge has
 established a Truancy Reduction Pilot Program under § 3–8C–02 of this subtitle; and



1 (2) To the extent that funds are provided in an annual State budget 2 for a Truancy Reduction Pilot Program.

3 3-8C-02.

4 (a) (1) The Circuit Administrative Judge of the First Circuit may 5 establish a Truancy Reduction Pilot Program in one or more of the juvenile courts in 6 Dorchester County, Somerset County, Wicomico County, and Worcester County.

7 (2) THE CIRCUIT ADMINISTRATIVE JUDGE OF THE SECOND 8 CIRCUIT MAY ESTABLISH A TRUANCY REDUCTION PILOT PROGRAM IN THE 9 JUVENILE COURT IN TALBOT COUNTY.

10 [(2)] (3) The Circuit Administrative Judge of the Third Circuit may 11 establish a Truancy Reduction Pilot Program in the juvenile court in Harford County.

12 [(3)] (4) The Circuit Administrative Judge of the Seventh Circuit 13 may establish a Truancy Reduction Pilot Program in the juvenile court in Prince 14 George's County.

15 (b) After consultation with the administrative judges of the first, SECOND, 16 third, and seventh circuits, the Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals may accept a gift 17 or grant to implement the pilot programs in each respective circuit.

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect19 June 1, 2011.
