Behavioral Health – Integration of Mental Health and Addiction Treatment Services

FOR the purpose of requiring the Deputy Secretary of Behavioral Health and Disabilities in the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to develop a certain plan and to convene a certain workgroup; providing for the membership of the workgroup; requiring the workgroup to make certain findings and recommendations; requiring the workgroup to make a certain report to certain committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date; and generally relating to the integration of mental health and addiction treatment services.
